TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2020

The Trustees of the Charity present their annual report and accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31st March 2020.

Governing Document and Constitution

The Charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and is governed by a constitution adopted on the 26th April 2017.

Organisation Structure

The Charity is managed by a Board of Trustees which meet regularly. The Trustees of the Charity are listed on the legal and administrative page. The Board of Trustees are ably supported by the project manager.

Objectives and Activities for Public Benefit

The Charity's objectives are to offer practical help to the elderly and disabled who are financially challenged in Faversham

and the surrounding neighbourhood (including some areas close to Faversham and Sittingbourne)

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's objectives.

Achievements and Performance

The past year has been another successful year for FACE, the charity is now established in the Umbrella centre at Faversham. KCC have provided us with core funding of £14,367 (2019 £14,367) and we have managed to find other sources of core funding, Kent Community Foundation have been very supportive and provided a grant of £10,000 . A list of Grants is shown in note 2, We would like to thank all our Grant providers and other supporters for their help in 2019/20 in particular Quay quilters and their efforts to raise £2,240

Our project manager Becky Duffy moved on in the year to become manager of Faversham Umbrella but the Trustees are delighted to report that after she resigned she agreed to be a Trustee and her assistance continues to be invaluable. We are though pleased to say we have found an excellent replacement in Georgina Todd. We are also pleased Trevor Abram accepted an invitation to remain as a Trustee after he retired from being Town Council representative. We are pleaed to welcome CIr Ed Thomas as our Faversham Town council representative. In addition to Quay Quilters our other main fundraising during the year was the plant stall in May 2019 and a Faversham brass concert in March 2020 shortly before Lockdown .

At the end of our financial year the government called for a Lockdown due to the Coronavirus Covid-19 fortunately our decorating season was coming to an end and the employed staff were able to carry on undertaking gardening jobs provided the appropriate social distancing was maintained, this was not always possible so FACE's income from client donations will be less in 2020/21. The Trustees are pleased to report that KCC have maintained their funding for 2020/21 and there is a grant again from Kent Community Foundation but fundraising and church donations are not possible until the restrictions on social distancing are lifted.

We thank our workforce and volunteers for the ongoing success of FACE without their hard work in the homes and gardens of our clients we would not have such a successful charity, their work is very much appreciated. We continue to hear positive experiences from our clients which are also greatly appreciated by the Trustees and our project manager.

We are sorry to report the death during the year of one of our former employees Doug Wilson who will be sadly missed by his family and all who knew him.

Financial Review

The accounts have been prepared on an accruals basis so as to reflect the true financial position of the Charity. The results are shown on page 5

Reserves Policy

The Trustees continue to look for new sources of income to build up their reserves, and our pleased to report we have achieved our target of 6 months expenditure.

The Charity will continue to search for new sources of Core funding, we will look for more volunteers and continue to raise our profile through attendance at fayres and other fundraising events.

During the year the Trustees have reviewed all major risks which the Charity could suffer and confirm all necessary action has been taken to mitigate.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2020

1 Accounting policies

The Principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial are as follows:

a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16th July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015). Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s)

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis. There are no material uncertainties related to events or conditions which would cast doubt on the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

b) Incoming resources

Income recognition policies

Items of income are recognised and included in the accounts when all the following criteria are met:

- the charity have entitlement to the funds;
- any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met or are fully within the control of the Charity.
- there is sufficient certainty that receipt of the income is considered probable; and
- the amount can be measured reliably

Incoming resources with related expenditure

When incoming resources have related expenditure the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported in the Statement of Financial Activities, SOFA.

Donations

Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

Volunteer help

The value of voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the Trustees' Annual Report.

c) Resources expended

All resources expended are recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

d) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Motor Vehicles 25%pa reducing balance Equipment 20%pa reducing balance

h) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets this criteria is charged to the fund.
