#### Structure, governance and management

#### Governing document

The Sidcup Rotary Club Benevolent Trust is a non government, non-political, non religious organisation. The governing document is a Deed of Trust dated 14th March 1963, amended on the 19th November 1980, which established the objects and powers of the Charity.

#### **Trustees and Management**

The Trustees of the charity are set out on page 1 of the Financial Statements. The Trustees are recruited from the existing serving Club Members, holding office from the first day of July in each year. The Trustees will be five in number comprising the President, Vice President and Honorary Treasurer for the time being of the Club, plus two past Presidents of the Club to be elected annually by simple majority in General Meeting. Any occasional vacancy which may occur shall be filled by a Past President elected annually by simple majority at any Club meeting. No Individual President shall hold office of Trustee for more than three consecutive years.

#### **Operational Structure**

The charity is based in Sidcup, Kent. This was set up by the Rotary Club of Sidcup to offer support in the community and to raise funds to assist those less fortunate than themselves. This is achieved by annual covenant donations made by Members, fund raising events and receipt of ad hoc donations and legacies.

#### **Accounting Controls**

The Charity has set up a fabric of accounting records and internal controls over recording in connection with Income, Expenditure, Assets and Liabilities.

A financial statement is prepared and submitted at a monthly Meeting as an overview for the Trustees.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### Objectives and activities

The relief of poverty, the advancement of education of religion and other purposes beneficial to the community provided the same are exclusively charitable purposes within the meaning of the law of England and Wales. In setting their objectives and planning their activities the Trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the Charity Commissioner's guidance on public benefit. Donations from the Trust are used to help the disadvantaged, both young and old, in the UK and abroad, whilst alleviating distress caused by disasters overseas are also targeted.

The main fund raising event for the year was the Trusts' traditional Christmas street collections. Other successful events included a charity Quiz and a Challenge Walk in Kent. These funds were enhanced by covenants, personal donations plus related gift aid and a further legacy receipt.

The Trust continues to contribute to the community offering support and financial assistance. The long standing Christmas Day Lunch for local disabled, elderly and persons living alone was once again held together with a circus visit for disabled and their carers. We have worked with Sidcup Partners Ltd to provide 3 defibrillators for public emergencies in Sidcup High Street and Station Road, Sidcup.

This year have also been mindful of the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and so made a series of extra donations to charities and for other purposes locally, nationally and internationally in keeping with the Trust's objectives. Most notably were financial and food donations totalling aound £8,000 to foodbanks. We also supported our health service heroes, air ambulance services plus organisations working in sectors dealing with mental health,domestic abuse, homelessness and care.

The Trust has had to adapt to the changing envoriment and its impact on fund raising. We also continue to review how we can be assist communities locally and overseas. We supported the Rotary Club of Bexley's appeal orfunds topurchase a kidney perfusion machine that can make kidneys more for transplant. Overseas we have committed funds to a joint project for the provision of small livestock in Rwanda which follows the Trust's successful jointly funded biodigester project in 2018/19.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

During the period the Charity received £38,610 in fund raising, donations and legacies to carry out the programmes mentioned above. £64,175 was given in support of charities and those in need.

#### Financial review

The charity maintains sufficient Unrestricted Reserves to cover its current and future operational requirements. Any excess reserves are distributed by way of charitable donations. Our balances may on occasion be high, however, this is due to the timing of donations, and a desire to ensure a steady distribution of support.

#### Plans for future periods

The charity will continue to support local, national and international charities in the future offering both service and financial assistance.

#### Objectives and activities (Continued)

#### **Investment Policy**

All funds are held in cash on current /deposit account and interest bearing investment accounts with a holding in a Charitible Investment Trust.

#### **Risk Management**

The Trustees actively review the risks which the charity faces on a regular basis. Health and Safety risk assessments are undertaken on all events.

The charity maintains a comprehensive system of accounting records and internal controls.

#### **Grants/Donations Policy**

The Rotary Heads of Committees present applications for appropriate grants/donations for consideration. Each application is considered by the Trustees/Council and referred to Club members. If approved the award is made.

#### Meetings

Meetings are held on a regular monthly basis. The Secretary deals with any correspondence and records the Minutes of each meeting. The Honorary Treasurer provides a Financial Statement which indicates the amount of available funds for distribution. The Heads of Committee put forward donation requests for consideration.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### 1 General Information

The Sidcup Rotary Club Benevolent Trust is a non government, non-political, non religious organisation It is a registered charity in England and Wales.

#### 2 Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice and the Charities Act 2011 (The 2011 Act). Assets and liabilities are initially recognised as historical cost unless otherwise stated in the relevant policy note.

#### Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### **Fund accounting**

Funds held by the charity are:

Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the members.

Restricted funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects and only lawfully used for a specific charitable purpose.

#### Income Recognition

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, there is sufficient certainty of receipt and the amount of the income can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Income from donations is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be reliably measured. Donations are recognised in the accounts when the charity have been notified of the amount and the date the donation will be received. This is normally when a donation has been received in the post or into the charity bank account.

Investment income on funds held on deposit or investment is recognised when notification is received, confirming the interest being paid or becoming payable.

The income from fund-raising ventures is shown gross with the associated costs then deducted.

#### **Expenditure Recognition**

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or contractual obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Fund raising expenditure is recognised as the cost is incurred.

Donations are payments made by the Trust in the furtherance of the objects of the charity. An application request for a donation will be considered by the Trustees and Council and, referred to members. If agreed the donation will be forwarded.

Expenditure on raising funds includes the cost of all fundraising activities and events.

#### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)**

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### Investments

Investments are initially recorded at cost and subsequently stated at cost plus/less any accumulated profit /losses.

#### **Financial Instruments**

The Charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

#### **Debtors**

Debtors are initially recorded at fair value and are assessed for impairment for each balance sheet date. If any impairments exist the debtors are re-measured to the present value of the expected future cash inflows.

#### Creditors

Creditors are initially recorded at fair value and are then re-measured to the present value of the expected future cash outflows.

#### 6 Restricted funds

The restricted funds shown in the accounts are primarily the balance of the legacy property investment detailed in note 7, net of monies expended on mahor repairs. They also include contributions totalling £1,340 from other Rotary Clubs towards a joint project in Rwanda which awaits match funding approval to commence in late 2020.

#### 7 Legacy

- 1) Legacy of a self contained flat in Sidcup. A life interest has been left to a friend of the deceased who is resident in the property. Funds were also received to enable the lease to be extended in 2016 and to meet major unforeseen property costs. During 2019/20 £3,715 was expended on a share of roof repairs. The current value of the investment stands at £23,068. Part of this investment now relates to unrestricted funds. The beneficial interest in the property may not be recognised or transferred until the life interest has been extinguished.
- 2) A fourth tranche, of £12,000, was received from solicitors acting for the Estate of another former Sidcup resident. These are unrestricted and are being applied in accordance with the Trust's charitable objectives at the discretion of the Trustees.
