#### Thursby Sport & Recreation Committee Registered Charity Number 1093446 Annual Report 2019-20

#### 1. Introduction

This report sets out the progress made by the Thursby Sport & Recreation Committee (hereafter referred to as 'the Charity') during the financial year 2019-20.

The report sets out the progress made during the year in terms of activities and progress on major projects, but also provides a summary of the financial and governance arrangements for the year.

#### 2. Activities during the Financial Year

The main focus of activity during the period has been to: -

- Maintain continued regular usage of the site;
- Embed processes and procedures for the safe operation of the site;
- Continue to raise the profile of the site within the local community;
- Secure the necessary investment to complete the new play area development project.

Further details of these are outlined in more details below: -

#### **Maintaining Regular Usage**

From August 2019 we embarked upon our third season of football being played on the site. The on-going agreement with Dalston Junior Black Reds have seen 1 x under 8, 2 x under 10, 1 x under 12, and 1 x under 14 teams play regular fixtures at the site. The Dalston Sailor FC adult men's team have also used the site for home fixtures during the season in the Carlisle & District Sunday Morning League, and the pitches have also been used by Crown Newlaithes FC adult men's team in the Cumberland County League on a Saturday afternoon. We have also seen occasional usage by Nelson Thomlinson School. A total of 64 competitive matches were played on the site during the 2019-20 season, which was unfortunately cut short in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This number is significantly lower than in the previous season, but it should be noted that there are usually many games played during the later stages of March and into April each season.

This has resulted in throughput figures for football alone of 1,602 participants, 256 volunteers, and 1,920 spectators being present at matches during the season.

These figures do not include the many hundreds of visits made to the site for social and recreational play and football activities which takes place every day. The Committee are pleased to see the facility being used so widely by the community.

It was pleasing to see the large numbers of people using the perimeter path around the playing field for regular exercise and walks during the COVID-19 lockdown, taking the opportunity to use the facilities at the field during their one hour per day of physical activity.

#### Develop Fit for Purpose Processes for Safe Operation of the Site

The Charity has worked hard with partners during this second year of operation to ensure that the users are able to do so safely. Things that have been considered have included: -

- Information on security to user groups;
- Issuing and registering of keys;
- Grounds maintenance and grass cutting arrangements;
- Monitoring health and safety and defects;

This will be an on-going process, and will be picked up by the Committee moving forward. It's disappointing to report that there has been a small number of low level vandalism incidents throughout the year, these issues have been publicised on the playing fields Facebook page, and in the local parish magazine. In all cases the issues have been resolved without the need to inform the Police.

#### Raising the Profile of the site within the local Community

#### **Fundraising Events**

To continue to raise the profile of the Charity in the local community, and to raise much needed funds, a series of fundraising events were organised over the course of the year. These events are invaluable in spreading the message about the aims and objectives of the Charity, and also help to galvanise support from the community. Events this year have included a big picnic, which also served as an official opening event for the new play area, 80's party night, and a Curry Night, as well as providing the refreshments at a Table Top Sale.

#### Securing the necessary investment to complete the new play area development project

The funding of £77,000 was secured to develop the new play area. Playdale Ltd were the approved contractor and work started on the installation during June 2019, taking around three weeks to complete. The new development has been welcomed by the community, and is proving extremely popular, with large numbers of users. The provision of benches also supports the social aspect of the facility, with many parents meeting whilst their children play.

An official opening event was held at the play area on 1 September 2019, and although a very wet day, it was attended by a few hardy souls!

#### 3. Financial Information

A full financial report is available on request. Summary details are as follows: -

Income was again higher than normal due to the numerous grant applications made for the play area development project, and was a figure of £62,551 for the year. Total expenditure, which was mainly revenue expenditure linked to on-going servicing of the site and the fundraising activities, coupled with payments relating to the playground development project was £83,972. This resulted in a reduction in balances from a figure of £32,492 at 1 April 2019 to a figure of £11,071 as at 31 March 2020.

The fundraising activities by the Charity, highlighted earlier raised a healthy net figure of £1,924 during the period; events included a big picnic, which also served as an official opening event for the new play area, 80's party night, and a Curry Night, as well as providing the refreshments at a Table Top Sale.

It was also pleasing to note an increased financial contribution being received through Thursby Parish Council. A report was prepared for the Council meeting in September 2018 seeking additional support, and following discussions, it has been agreed that the Council will support the Charity to the value of £3,000 each year moving forward. This development is seen as vitally important to help the long term sustainability of the Charity, as well as recognition from the Council of the vital role physical activity, and the provision of high quality local facilities can play in supporting the community to be healthy and well.

Moving into 2020-21, the Committee will be looking closely at the financial position, taking account of significant levels of lost income due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Moving forward, the Committee will assess the impact of COVID-19 on the financial position of the Charity as soon as this is possible. Effort will be made to re-establish regular football usage as soon as it is possible.

As well as embarking on a number of usual fundraising activities and events, the Charity are also considering re-introducing an outdoor music festival/fun day at the Playing Field. To be held in May 2021, which will hopefully become an annual event, raising much needed funds for both the Playing Field, but also the School PFA as well. Discussions are at an early stage, but it is hoped that this will be a possibility.
