The objects of the CIO are:

TO PROMOTE SOCIAL INCLUSION FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT BY PREVENTING PEOPLE WHO ARE REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS WHO IDENTIFY AS LGBT+ FROM BECOMING SOCIALLY EXCLUDED, TO RELIEVE THE NEEDS OF THOSE PEOPLE AND TO ASSIST THEM TO INTEGRATE INTO SOCIETY, PARTICULARLY BUT NOT EXCLUSIVELY BY:

- PROVIDING WORKSHOPS, ADVOCACY AND GENERAL SUPPORT
- INCREASING AND CO-ORDINATING OPPORTUNITIES FOR MEMBERS OF THE ABOVE COMMUNITIES TO ENGAGE WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES
- RAISING PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE ISSUES AFFECTING REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS WHO IDENTIFY AS LGBT+, BOTH GENERALLY AND IN RELATION TO THEIR SOCIAL EXCLUSION

Volunteers from Time to be Out have supported LGBT+ asylum seekers by:

- 1. accompanying them to meetings with their legal representatives and the Home Office
- 2. providing practical and financial assistance in cases of hardship
- 3. arranging and funding social events to help break down their isolation
- 4. encouraging and supporting self-help support arrangements
- 5. engaging in advocacy with relevant agencies and charities

During the lockdown beginning in March 2020 it was impossible for the beneficiaries to attend social events or have face-to-face meetings. Time to be Out therefore arranged extra financial support to ensure that all the beneficiaries had mobile phone data or internet access in an attempt to mitigate their isolation. Where appropriate, speakers of other languages were offered 1:1 English language tuition via Whatsapp.

The trustees consider that they have complied with their duties to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.

Achievements and performance

We were able to provide direct practical, financial and emotional support to about 35 LGBT+ asylum seekers. About a dozen of these were granted refugee status between June 2019 and June 2020 and we were able to help these individuals take the next steps as they integrated into UK society (as regards housing, employment, studies etc.).

A wider group of asylum seekers across the north of England benefited from Time to be Out's activities. People who had been socially isolated were put in touch with each other and with other sources of support in their areas.

We have managed to help raise awareness of the particular needs of LGBT+ asylum seekers and refugees amongst a number of groups and individuals who are likely to encounter them (e.g. those in other asylum charities and LGBT+ organisations). We trust that this will help to foster social integration in the medium and long term.
