To advance the religion of Islam, by means of, but not exclusively, promoting the teachings and tenets of Islam, provision of facilities for worship and provision of facilities for Islamic education, in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'aan and the Sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him) as defined and interpreted by the Hanafi Deobandi School of Thought ("Doctrine"); (2)

To relieve financial hardship among the poor, the underprivileged, victims of natural and man-made disasters and people in need, by means of, but not exclusively, making grants or loans for providing or paying for items, equipment, treatment, services and facilities for the benefit of the said persons..

During the year the charity maintained the Mosque and Maktab facility for local public benefitting hundreds of people and also delivered the following:

- In April & May 2019, the Masjid was fully repainted and redecorated with new carpet fitted in the reception area, stairs, landing, hallway and back exit area. In May 2019, we also conducted our annual deep cleaning of existing carpets in preparation for Ramadhan.
- We offered our regular Tarawih prayer services between May to June 2019 during Ramadhan, with 3 external hafiz of Quran who were accommodated and serviced in the Masjid, supported by 3 local hafiz of Quran leading the evening prayers. 2 Tarawih prayer sessions were delivered, one earlier in the evening and another late-night session after midnight for the convenience of attendees who work late into the evening.
- We provided our usual 2 Eid prayer sessions on both Eid festivals, Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Adha, accommodating hundreds of people both local and from beyond.
- In July 2019, one of our Imams provided a Hajj and Umrah seminar in English for preparing around 2 dozen local people who had decided to go to the annual Hajj pilgrimage in 2019.
- In October 2019, the Masjid arranged a trip to Islamic Dawaah Academy's 26th Annual Youth Conference in Leicester, including local youths along with their quardians.
- We held regular Islamic programmes throughout the year delivered by external visiting scholars, including notable events on 1st September 2019 and 15th March 2020.
- We culminated the 2019-2020 year with commencement of preparations for coronavirus / COVID-19, with the Masjid going into full lockdown from Monday 23rd March 2020.

The activities have helped us to advance Islam for public benefit. The trustees have had due regard to the guidance of the Charity Commission on public benefit and are satisfied that they are acting in accordance with that guidance and are making a real difference for the benefit of the public.

The charity held unrestricted reserves of £14,262 which didn't include the loans undertaken, liabilities and the properties purchased for the charity's use. The trustees do not have a reserves policy, but will utilise any surplus funds for future charitable expenditure.
