It is fair to say that 2020 has been a year which has not been experienced in most of our lifetimes due to the Covid 19 pandemic.

Nevertheless, we attempted to keep the Hall open as much as possible but in the end had to close the Hall on two lengthy occasions due to Government advice associated with the Lockdowns which had been introduced.

We were fortunate that Peter and Tina Brown arranged the cleaning and sanitising of the Hall together with ordering the sanitising equipment and providing the signage required. We have also been very grateful to our cleaner Sue Child who has done a wonderful job in making sure that the Hall met the necessary hygiene standards.

In September Tina (the Manager) decided that after twenty years it was time to retire. We are incredibly grateful to Tina who ran the Hall very successfully and efficiently over all those years. She will no doubt enjoy all the time she now has to pursue her own interests.

The Manager's post was advertised locally and over thirty expressions of interest were received. A short list was drawn up and Interviews were carried out. We are pleased that we were able to offer the post to Emma Byrne who commenced her duties in early November.

During the year, the Trustees held three formal committee meetings together with several ad hoc/ZOOM. These meetings were in addition to the Annual General Meeting.

The hall has lost a significant amount of income due to the closures which hopefully will be made up as matters return to something like normal.

The Treasurer will report on the current financial position of the hall.

The Heritage centre although receiving planning permission has not been progressed due to Covid and the Hall's financial position. It is expected that we will recommence the Centre work during 2021.

The Committee continued to place a high priority on maintaining the hall and its surroundings in good order. The Trustees continued to focus on reducing the Hall's energy costs. Adding to this most of the lighting is now by LED's.

General maintenance and decoration of the buildings continued.

In conclusion, the Trustees would like to take this opportunity to thank those hirers who have continued to support the Hall during the very difficult times this year.
