Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

"To empower volunteers to serve their communities, meet humanitarian needs, encourage peace and promote international understanding through Lions Clubs". In accordance with the objectives of Lions Clubs International and to follow the guidance issued by the Charity Commission with regard to public benefit, the Club operates as follows.

We are involved in a wide variety of Fund raising activities such as :-

- -Running BBQs at a number of popular local events.
- -Organising Easter Egg raffles in conjunction with about 25 local organisations, shops and pub/restaurants, proceeds to go to the local hospice and other local charities.
- -Organising a full day collection on behalf of the Marie Curie Cancer Care daffodil appeal.
- -Collecting at a local supermarket to raise funds to purchase Christmas parcels for those in need.
- -Maintain the tradition of roasting chestnuts in the Market Square as part of the town's Christmas celebrations as supported by Aylesbury Town Council.

Funds so raised enable us to :-

- -Make donations to a number of local charities and national charities with local connections.
- provide assistance, monetary and physical, to individual cases of need. -provide outings & activities for disadvantaged single mothers and their children.
- -manage the procurement, supply and distribution of the Lions "Message in a Bottle" and "Message in a Wallet" schemes.
- -make up 45 Christmas parcels for distribution to local people in need.
- -We also organise the collection of unwanted secondhand tools and school books for forwarding to underdeveloped territories. We have recently started the collection of unwanted spectacles.

We have drawn up a policy on grant making which includes, inter alia,-

- -The Club aims to make grants and donations where it is thought they will make an appreciable difference.
- -Applications from Aylesbury and the surrounding area are generally given priority.
- -The Club will consider international and national funding requests received via the Lions Clubs International Foundation.
- -The Club will not normally support applications from large national charities except where they meet a particular need in Aylesbury or surrounding areas.

We do not make any investments, except for purchases of items which are necessary for our fundraising activities, and which are written off in the year of purchase.

All Aylesbury Lions Club members are volunteers – assisted at times by friends and relatives, again entirely on a voluntary basis.
