Elsecar Recreation Ground is managed and maintained as a public park by the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as trustee. Rental income represents the majority of the income for the ground during this period.

The maintenance of the ground has been heavily subsidised by the Council during this period. The Council has provided in excess of £81,000 from its own and other charitable funds towards the upkeep of the site. The Council continues to ensure that the recreation ground is maintained to an acceptable standard for the public benefit of local inhabitants and that it fulfils its obligations as trustee. The recreation ground has, once again, been awarded Green Flag status, which is a significant achievement.

The Council as trustee has complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.
