Para 1.20	In recognising the importance of 'on the ground' expertise when working in this field, The Helen Bailey Trust has continued to work in partnership with Seven Stories (The National Centre for Children's Books) a registered charity whose mission is to collect, champion and celebrate children's literature. The principles and primary objectives of this ongoing and successful partnership are to deliver innovative learning programmes that inspire and enable disadvantaged young people and their teachers in the North East of England to take diverse approaches to creative writing by sparking empathy with the creative process and enabling young people to see themselves as writers. The Helen Bailey Trust has committed to fund a Reader in Residence programme.
		The Helen Bailey Trust has committed to fund a Reader in Residence programme from 2019 through to 2021 as an evolution from the successful pilot project co-funded and delivered by Seven Stories in 2018/19. By providing a year-long programme of focused activity within a school, supported by expert practitioners, contact with professional writers and augmented by use of Seven Stories own unique Collection, young people and their teachers will develop a deeper understanding of the thoughts and ideas that shape an author's storytelling, inviting exploration of the personal, social, civic and environmental questions of relevance to them.
