## Structure, governance and management

Mishon is constituted under a trust deed, dated 20th September 2012 and is a Registered Charity with a registered number 1149271. Recruitment and appointment of new trustees would be in line with the Trust Deed and with the consent of the trustees. The criteria set for the suitable candidate would be someone who is sensitive to the needs and demands of the organisation. There is no chief executive officer. The day to day affairs are undertaken by a devoted team of individuals on a voluntary basis on behalf of the trustees. All major decisions are taken collectively by the trustees and all the trustees give of their time freely. The trustees are unpaid and details of any related party transactions are disclosed as applicable in the notes to the accounts. The arrangements for setting the pay of the charity's employees is the sole domain of the trustees.

# **Objectives and Activities**

The Aims of the Charity are as follows 1) To promote and protect the physical and mental health of families who are in need because of their social or economic circumstances through the provision of financial assistance, support, therapeutic activities and/or practical advice. 2) The promotion of any other exclusively charitable objects and purposes as the trustees see fit, provided that they are regarded as charitable by the law of England and Wales.



## **Public benefit**

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting grant making policy for the year.

# Grant making policy



The charity is funded by donations and grants. The charity gives out grants in line with the above objects. The charity paid out a total of £20,000 in grants to individuals comprising of holiday grants as well as grants falling in line with the charity's objects. The trustees consider all requests which they receive and make donations based on the level of funds available.

## Achievements and performance

Day trips took place during the summer and Easter school holidays, where 500 children/young people took part in a range of trips thus giving them opportunities to enjoy quality time in a safe environment, and access to activities they would not have otherwise.

- \* Collection of surplus goods from local bakeries, grocery shops, greengrocers and restaurants and delivery to local needy families.
- \* Organisation of volunteers to accompany ill to hospital appointments, taking over bedside duty of children in hospital whether night or day and support for mothers with daily housekeeping chores.
- Education promoting good financial budgeting and parenting skills.



This has proven a very popular workshop, and we hope to expand the number of sessions and slots available on individual basis rather than group settings which tend to be more focused on each persons needs.

\* Proactive promotion of the value of giving and contributing to the wider community. Young people have become part of the 'Mishon' family as they help us both with the holiday activities as well as distribution of food

\*Holiday periods are extremely stressful times for families facing the challenge of having a child with severe disabilities. As part of the support offered, we have managed to provide a few children with a holiday grant to attend a sleep away camp thus giving the

whole family much needed respite.

\* Distribution of both new and second-hand household items including furniture, clothing, cleaning materials and baby equipment. This project expanded and a new project Simchas Suri is currently in place where toys and games are distributed to ill and disadvantaged children and young people.

# The charities goals for the future

- 1. To expand our range of holiday activities in line with demand from local community
- 2. Develop a website for easy access to users and participates planning and delivery of activities
- 3. Increase the level of funds to enable continued service development
- 4. To include new projects within the program, including for those with disabilities
- 5. To continue to run the full range of services for financially disadvantaged and socially isolated families



Unfortunately, the trustees have had to make the decision to relocate the food bank to



a temporary location due to a recent increase in rental costs. This has impacted on the number of families served through the food bank and trustees are now looking at securing more permanent premises at lower costs to the charity to ensure we reach out to all those need our support

The trustees wish to express their appreciation to the various grant making authorities listed in the grant income note to the accounts. The trustees are certain that without their support these youth clubs would simply not have taken place.

# Financial review

The trustees feel that the activity reflects the profile and standing within the local community have been delighted with the level of support from the community. The impact for future year's expenditure is self-evident and the trustees would like to record their appreciation for all the financial and voluntary support received from benefactors during the course of the year.

# Reserves policy

The Trustees aim to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the Charity at a level of at least six months running costs and up to one year's running costs. The Trustees are pleased to have achieved a level of reserves for the Charity this past year, in accordance with their aim.

# Responsibilities of the Trustees

Charity Law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the Balance Sheet date, and of its incoming resources, including income and expenditure for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees should follow best practice and: a) Select suitable accounting policies and the apply them consistently. b) Make judgements



and estimates that are reasonable and prudent. c) Follow applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP 2015, updated May 2008 disclosing and explaining any departures in the financial statements. d) Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation. The Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them as Trustees to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charity Law. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other regularities.

#### 1) Principal Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Accounting**

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

# Accountants Report to the Trustees on the Unaudited Accounts of the Charity Mishon For The Year Ended 31 March 2019

We report on the financial statements of Mishon for the year ended 31 March 2019 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting By Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (Issued 2015), and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities 102 (effective 2016), and the accounting policies set out therein.
