## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st March 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020. They are also prepared to meet the requirements for a directors' report and accounts for Companies Act purposes.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, applicable law and the requirements of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

### **Objectives and Activities and achievements for Public Benefit**

The Church adopted the model Memorandum and Articles of Association for local Assemblies of God churches. Its objectives are:

- the advancement of the Christian Faith
- the relief of sickness and financial hardship
- the advancement of education

These are achieved by running a church, based in the Somerstown area of Portsmouth.

The Kings Church continued its regular activities: Sunday services, small groups, student work, prayer meetings and alongside this undertook various activities/projects to benefit the local community. The charity also continued to support charitable work oversees in Costa Rica, Uganda, Guatemala and Nepal as well as local projects in Portsmouth. When planning activities for the year, the trustees have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion.

The charity has been actively developing the site that was purchased from the Church of England in January 2018 and work on an extension for a ground floor warehouse for the Foodbank and brand new toilet facilities was completed in July 2019. These facilities included a Changing Places accessible toilet, enhancing the accessibility of the site and its services. A building committee consisting of staff, trustees and volunteers met to oversee the long-term plan for this.

A priority for the charity is work with local children and youth - The charity continued to run weekly kids and youth programmes. The charity has also developed a strong base of work with children and adults with learning difficulties.

Community Projects – The Kings Church continued to develop its work within the community. Food Bank - The project continued to see increasing numbers access food at a point of crisis. Clients once referred access the service at drop in sessions provided at the project base. The project has worked to add additional services and work with other local groups within the city. Circle of Support - The Circle of Support project, funded by the Big Lottery's Help Through Crisis Fund, works with existing Foodbank clients to provide them support for the issues that caused them to connect with the Foodbank in the first place. This enables the Foodbank team to offer more than just short-term support to clients.

The Church has had to adapt its method of operation due to the Covid-19 restrictions put in place by the Government late in this financial year. The immediate implication of this was a huge increase in the demand on the Foodbank and the movement of all other activities such as services and other groups to an online form. With the church not able to meet in the normal way the building has been used to fulfil the Foodbank demand. The church had made significant investment into infrastructure (such as website, live streaming etc) meaning the church has been able to continue these activities as well as provide ways for people to continue to support the church and the Foodbank financially (through online giving).

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st March 2020

#### **Financial Review**

Overall income has reduced from the previous year due to a smaller number of grants received towards building refurbishment costs. The statement of financial activities shows net incoming resources of £28,070 (2019 £81,971). The surplus was used towards funding the capital repayments of the mortgage. Restricted funds held at the end of the year include £172,486 grants and donations received to fund capital expenditure. These funds will be matched against expenditure over the estimated useful economic life of assets. The balance of restricted funds (£65,004) received will be expended for the purpose given during the coming 12 months.

Total reserves at 31st March 2020 stood at £594,676, including £237,490 restricted funds.

#### Reserves

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be 1 month of the resources expended, which equates to approximately £25,000 in general funds. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. The current level of free reserves is £30,262. The trustees, along with the leadership team are looking particularly at our staff costs and other expenditure to look at ways to increase the level of reserves over the next 12 months.

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

Kings Church Portsmouth is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 3rd January 2007 and registered as a charity on 14th June 2007. The organisation was formerly a charitable trust by the same name and the company took responsibility of its activities on 1st April 2008. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

#### Trustees

The trustees (members of the church council) who served during the year are listed on page 1. New members are appointed from the membership of the church by the existing church council.

#### Organisational Structure

The trustees delegate the day to day running of the church to a senior leadership team consisting of the lead pastor, who acts as chairman and other church leaders.

## Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

#### 1 General information

Hope (Portsmouth) is a company, limited by guarantee, incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act 2006 and Charities Act 2011. The address of the registered office is provided in Reference and administrative details. Details of the charity's operations are provided in the Report of the Trustees.

#### 2 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### **Basis of preparation**

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006. The accounts include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Trustees' Report, all of which are continuing.

#### **Fund accounting policy**

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

#### **Income**

Voluntary income including donations and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Income from tax reclaims are included in the statement of financial activities at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

Income derived from events is recognised as earned (that is, as the related goods or services are provided).

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract or where entitlement to grant funding is subject to specific performance conditions. Grant income included in this category provides funding to support programme activities and is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

#### **Expenditure**

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

#### **Fixed assets**

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are initially recorded at cost.

### **Depreciation**

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Aberystwyth church plant - In September the church family stood with a family as they pursued the call of God on their lives to move to West Wales and plant a church there. The church has committed to supporting them with an initial financial gift from our budget of missional giving as well as ongoing encouragement and support as the church is planted and begins to grow.

The church runs a foodbank which is part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by The Trussell Trust. It provides three days' nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people in crisis who are referred by agencies and other organisations.

A grant was received in 2017-18 from Lloyds Foundation towards the cost of an organisational review.

A donation was received to fund the cost of camera equipment purchased in the year.

Monies are given for various specific church projects during the year both locally and overseas.

The refurbishments and Food bank IT funds represent specific grants and donations received to fund expenditure which are being matched against depreciation charged.
