Achievements and performance

- Our Code of Conduct and Ethics is published on the website and is evaluated and refined in response to on-going learning in the field of Ethics. This year we have sought to raise our members' awareness of work with vulnerable adults and also children and young people, and to recognise the responsibilities involved. Specifically we have actively promoted advice regarding Regulated Work and Safeguarding. We have communicated the requirement for practitioners to undertake recognised Safeguarding training, relevant and relative to their clients. We now recognise Safeguarding training as part of our members' CPD hours. We have already made available to UK members access to DBS checking.
- 2. Our independence from regulatory and other such bodies is shown in our response to the NICE (National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) draft guidance on PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). Following our submission, NICE has substantially revised its attitude towards EFT and recommended further research.
- The complaints procedure is published. We had one complaint about a practitioner's newsletter, but it was not to do with EFT and the complaint was not upheld We had further serious disclosures about the Australian trainer working through the rehab programme we had set so he is now permanently de-registered. We had one request to talk through a concern about a practitioner but it proved impossible to contact the complainant despite attempts by two members of the ethics committee. A practitioner was given requested advice about contacting the police when a client disclosed domestic violence. There are no outstanding complaints. Wherever possible, we adopt a 'Restorative Justice approach of seeking understanding of what went wrong and restoration and reconciliation, rather than adopting a punitive approach.

A USA member of the ethics committee decided to step back because of perceived potential conflicts with our approach to ethics and the developing USA regulatory system.

Proactively, we have been applying learning gained through experience to updating the code of conduct and developing ethics function, e.g. in agreeing the mentor workshop for delivery next year to help improve standards.

4. The training curriculum and the standards of training are constantly

monitored by the volunteers of the Training
Board, who this year, have continued
developing clearer guidance, more detailed
training guides and specified syllabi for our
accredited trainers.
5 We are actively working on how we
can improve the depth and the breadth of
our work by being more inclusive
geographically, racially, of differences in
gender identity and social and financial
status.
6. We offer a free downloadable basic
EFT training manual to members of the
public who subscribe to our Newsletter. This
has been downloaded 3898 times. To
increase the accessibility, this has now been
translated into French, and a German
version is pending
7. We maintain a Practitioner Directory
on the website, which serves to inform
members of the public who are seeking fully
qualified, competent and ethical
practitioners.
8. We have an active Communications
team of volunteers who host a number of
social media sites for members to meet,
share and seek guidance or support.
Additionally, our mentoring requirement
includes group mentoring, which leads to our
trainers setting up small mentoring
communities and groups for discussion,
support and consequent improvement or
practice standards and public safety.
9. The newsletter is published regularly
10. We have a block agreement with a
specialist insurance provider.

Our principal source of funding was from membership donations (£61,744). Promoting affiliate links resulted in a further £8,994 and we received £6,511 from our accreditation processes including online exams. Management of our membership and accreditation/training programmes were, of course, significant expenses (£16,827 and £7,979 respectively). As an international charity serving members and the public around the world we relied on digital communication and our excellent website for the dissemination of information. These costs amounted to £10,705. Our first non-English-speaking landing pages came online for the Netherlands, Austria, Switzerland and Germany. With a view further to protect and promote our charitable purposes worldwide, we launched a new name and identity for the association as EFT International and pursued trademarks for the new logo, capitalising additional costs of £3058. Our General Reserve needs to be of the order of at least £43,000 to keep the organisation afloat for, say, six months in the event of a sudden or unprecedented absence of income. EFT has a growing research base but, in order to advance its acceptance amongst the scientific and traditional healthcare community, more is needed, so we hold an EFT Research Fund reserve to this end. £91,241 N/A

Treasurer's Report for the year ended 31st March 2020

The attached financial statements for the above year are presented on the basis of Historical Cost. The Accruals method of accounting is applied as this best represents the Association's operating results for the financial year and its reserves at the end of the year.

The figures show that the Association remained solvent and continued to operate effectively.

The largest contributor to income was again membership donations. These were held at rates introduced on 1st April 2018. The organisation has continued to build affiliate links with other organisations and this contributed a further £8,994.

Management and administration of the membership was our main expense. In supporting its members, EFT International endeavours to uphold the highest standards of education, training and practice, strengthen its global standing, provide assurance and be of service to the general public worldwide.

Our website underpins this work. We anticipate that it will continue to serve the Association, membership and public and further contribute to its income-gathering capacity. This accounting period completed the fourth of five years in which its total developmental costs are being amortised.

A project to rebrand as EFT International was launched in April 2019, and these costs are being amortised over ten years. The Association sought trademarks and continued to work towards establishing ever higher professional and ethical standards. The first non-Englishspeaking web landing pages became operational during the year.

A total of £1,100 in ex-gratia payments was shared between volunteers in token recognition of their dedicated work on behalf of the membership and for the wider dissemination of EFT.

Overall, the Statement of Financial Activities for the financial year shows an Operating Surplus of £15,012 for the year. Our total Reserve Funds at 31st March 2020 including those set aside for EFT Research stood at £91,241 (as compared with £76,229 at 31st March 2019).

As this accounting year ended, the world entered a global pandemic but the organisation has continued to operate effectively.

1. Accounting Period and Compliance

2.1 Accounting

The Accounts have been prepared under the Historical Cost Convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note.
