Meeting the challenge of a global pandemic

The disciples considered children to be a noisy nuisance, expecting them to go and play quietly in a corner. Jesus' attitude was totally different, he welcomed the children, he called them to himself, not just to play with them, but to welcome them into the kingdom of God. He saw them as a precious example to us all. (Luke 18v16)

Our goal at Bridge Builders is to work with local Christians and churches to fulfil Jesus' vision, for the children of Stevenage and wider Hertfordshire. Over many years, staff and volunteers have built up good and trusting relationships with many of the local primary schools so we are in the privileged position of being Christians explaining our faith to children, as part of the Religious Education curriculum.

During this year there have been some significant changes at Bridge Builders. At the end of May, Peter Gordon retired as Honorary Director and kindly agreed to become a Trustee, so we have not lost his invaluable financial expertise. Steph Knell has very ably stepped up to be acting Director and to lead Bridge Builders day to day. We have also said farewell to Alex Horlock and Revd. Don Dowling as Trustees and welcomed Penny Paton, Helen Gale and Judy Brown as new Trustees. I would like to thank Peter for his excellent leadership over the last five years and Alex and Don for the tremendous contribution they have made over many years, and to welcome Penny, Helen and Judy.

Covid 19 has severely restricted how we work together. Early on we took the decision to cancel the final two weeks of The Easter Journey 2020 so as to relieve the pressure on partner churches, volunteers and schools to participate in face-to-face activities.

Steph and her team have done a fantastic job in adapting to the CV19 restrictions producing online assemblies and a virtual version of the Christmas Journey that schools can safely use. We have taken advantage of the Government's furlough schemes, making up the staff pay to 100% from Bridge Builders resources, which we will continue so long as finances allow. Most of our costs are associated with paying the salaries of our staff, and as grant giving bodies tend not to fund salaries or operating costs of established organisations, we are very reliant on local Christians and churches supporting the work of Bridge Builders.

Our focus is to continue to work with local schools, even within the tight constraints of the school curriculum and CV19 restrictions. Using modern technology, we are still able to reach out and tell children about the love of God and the salvation of His son Jesus.

The Trustees would like to thank all of our supporters for their continued and generous support for the work of Bridge Builders through prayer, volunteering and financial gifts.

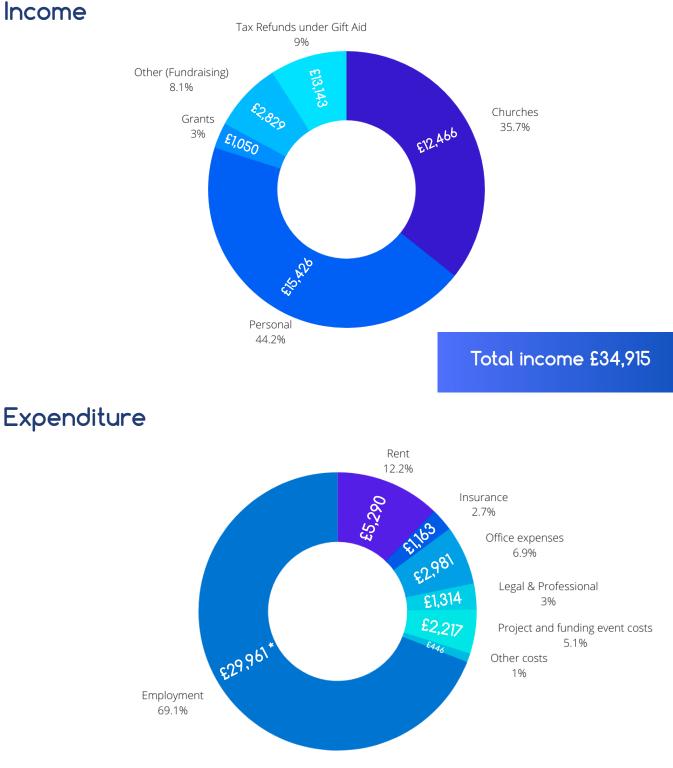
The Easter Journey also started well, with 1120 children booked into six churches in Stevenage, Knebworth and Hertford. However, the Covid-19 pandemic was starting to have an impact, and after one week of The Easter Journey we made the hard decision to cancel the rest of the event. A week after we made that decision, the whole country was in lockdown. We are aware that it was extremely disappointing for those churches who couldn't be involved, and we are praying that we will be able to work with those churches again in the years to come.

The rest of the year was spent making plans for this academic year, and changing those plans as the pandemic developed! We are grateful for the thinking, and work, that Inga Voss (ExploRE Manager – Journeys) put in towards a Virtual Christmas Journey before she left us at the end of the summer term. That planning has stood us in very good stead as we have started the new academic year.

As this new year began we changed the way we worked. Assemblies have been recorded and put on our YouTube channel for schools to access – do have a look. We have also recorded a Virtual Christmas Journey, so children don't miss the opportunity to hear about Jesus this Christmas. Through all these changes, our desire remains the same; to introduce Jesus to the children of Stevenage and beyond. We long for each child to have an opportunity to think about who Jesus is, and for Him to have an impact on their lives. Life may have changed but our mission has not.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year.

Objects of the charity

To advance the Christian faith To advance education in accordance with Christian principles To provide facilities in the interest of social welfare

The vision of the Trust is that all children will have opportunities to explore the values of the Christian faith, and to look forward with hope as they experience Christian love in action.

The mission is to reach out to primary school children, and introduce them to Christian faith and love through conducting Christian Assemblies and teaching Christian religious education in schools in conjunction with local churches, and by organising themed visits to churches.

Government

The policy and operating decisions of the charity rest with the Trustees who meet formally six times each year to monitor the activities of the charity, to set policy and overall direction. There are currently six Trustees. New trustees are appointed by the Trustees who seek committed Christians with broad experience representing a wide range of denominations.

Day to day operations are run by a part time Acting Director supported by a number of parttime highly motivated professionals working in schools or supporting the activities from the central resource centre.

Review of Activities

During the year just completed some **4,500** children have been involved in activities led by Bridge Builders in schools and churches. These activities have included visits of 1085 year 2 children to three churches where they learn about the characters and the events around the Christmas Journey, many attending assemblies in schools. This year RE lessons were delivered to years 1 through 5 in one schools reaching 540 children.

This year out of the 1120 children that were booked to come to Easter Journey only 290 were able to attend the two hosting churches during the first week as we had to cancel after this first week due to the Coronavirus COVID19 pandemic.

Financial Review

In the year to 31st August 2020 the Trust had income of £34,915 and expenditures of £38,714 leaving a deficit in the year of £3,799.

The income derived mainly from personal giving, including associated Gift Aid £18,569; from local partnering churches, £12,467 and from sale of lessons £500

Expenditure in the year was mainly for payroll costs, £29,961 offset by the HMRC JRS Grant £4,658 when some staff were furloughed due to the Covid19 pandemic; Rent of Resource Centre, £5,290; Insurance £1,163 and HR consultancy £1,314.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have decided that a reserve of cash and other current assets less current liabilities is held, sufficient to fund an orderly wind down of the activities of the Charity, should that ever become necessary. Currently this reserve is estimated to be a minimum of £20,000. At the end of the accounting year reserves stood at £32,405, £3,495 of which is committed to the completion of an IT related project part funded by a grant from Allchurches Trust.

Trustees' Responsibilities

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the income & expenditure of the charity for the year.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.
