Governing Document

The Rotary Club of Lymington Charity Trust Fund was founded by Trust deed on 19th October 1993 and is constituted according to the deed.

The Trust Fund is related through the Trustees and its fund raising activities to the Rotary Club of Lymington. The Rotary Club of Lymington is part of Rotary International District 1110 locally known as Rotary Wessex, which is part of the Rotary International movement a worldwide organisation comprising more than 1.2 million Rotarians in 33,000 Clubs in over 200 countries and geographic areas.

Objects

The main objectives of the Charity Trust Fund are for the relief of the poor and needy and for such charitable purpose as the trustees, on behalf of the Rotary Club of Lymington, shall decide.

Risk Management

The major risks to which the Charity Trust Fund is exposed have been reviewed by the Trustees and systems established to mitigate these risks.

Activity and Achievement for the Public Benefit

The COVID-19 pandemic impacted on our fund-raising projects in 2020 but we were fortunate that our main such project in 2019/2020, the annual Lymington Summer Spectacular, was held in August 2019 and, taking into account monies paid in advance of our event, netted just over £21,000 for general Rotary Supported Charities.

In December 2019 despite adverse weather conditions our Christmas Street Collections with Santa raised just over £1,700 for distribution to local charities supporting young children. In all The Charity paid out £36,888.99 to 48 projects, of which £7,434.63 was paid to 11 International projects and £29,455.36 to 37 local community based projects. See the accounts for a full analysis.

At 30th June 2020 the amount in the Charity Trust Fund was £9,368.30. The Trustees have continued after the year end to make donations to local and international projects from the Trust Fund monies and are committed to distributing the accumulated funds.

Statement of Public Benefit

The Trustees confirm they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commissioner's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims, objectives and plans for the current year.

The Trustees confirm the Charity Trust Fund meets the two principles of public benefit namely:

That there must be an identifiable benefit or benefits and they must be clear and related to the objectives of the Charity and must be balanced against any detriment or harm; and that the benefit must be to the public or a section of the public and that the beneficiaries must be appropriate to the aims of the Charity and must not be unreasonably restricted and that those in poverty must not be excluded from the opportunity to benefit.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ascertain the financial position of the charity and to ensure that the financial statements comply with the requirements of the Charity (Accounts & Reports) Regulations 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
