Governance

Kids Care London is a charity registered with the Charity Commission (Registration No. 1096406) that aims to improve the lives, and provide respite for children with disabilities. The charity was formed on the 7th March 2003 and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees Appointment, Induction and Training

The power to appoint new trustees is vested in the existing Trustees. New trustees are recruited on the basis of their competence, specialist skills, and those who are able to promote the objectives of the Charity. All trustees have either a child or other family member with disabilities. New trustees are appointed by a resolution of the current Trustees, which is recorded in the minutes and signed by the new trustee. New trustees are inducted into the workings of the Charity by the current Trustees which include an understanding of the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, their legal obligations under charity act and company law, the organisational structure, safeguarding children and the recent financial performance of the charity. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events which enhance their knowledge and skill, thereby improving the performance of their role. The Trustees are responsible for governance of the organisation, and the Chair and Treasurer take an active part in strategic management and fundraising. None of the Trustees have been paid either for expenses incurred on behalf of or for services provided to the Charity, or have had any beneficial interest in the Charity.

Message from the Trustees of Kids Care

We are delighted to present our annual report and accounts for the year ending 30th November 2019. This is a year we complete with pride for it has been filled with progress, achievement and successes.

This year Camp Horizon was based in 2 accommodations, Kingswood Peak Venture and Kingswood Overstrand Hall. Due to the fact that we occupied two buildings from one supplier we were able to negotiate a great price which enabled us to serve more children. The campers were split according to age and abilities enabling them to gain even more out of the high quality, educational program at Camp Horizon. As usual, the campers had a fantastic time. They spent their days breathing in the fresh country air while enjoying a wide range of activities both on-site and off-site. Due to their disabled status, we were able to obtain reductions on their admissions fees. Some of the places they visited included: Legoland, Diggerland, Trampoline parks and many more fun and educational locations.

Our volunteer fundraiser was hard at work helping the parents get the most funding they can to help them pay their minimal deposit, and more if possible. She has been really successful, and we hope for more success in the future.

Aims of Kids Care London

- 1- Promote and advance the education, training, and general advancement in life of children and young people, from the Boroughs of Hackney, and Haringey, Barnet, Gateshead and Greater Manchester who have physical, mental, or behavioural disabilities, and are financially deprived; so as to empower them to maximise their potential and develop as individuals and members of society.
- 2- To provide a warm and caring environment in which disabled and disadvantaged children and young people may access recreational and leisure opportunities catered to their individual needs.

Review of activities, performance achievements

Kids Care London provides a summer residential programme for children and young people with a wide range of SEN. Once again, the Charity organised a two-week residential programme for special needs children and young people.

Camp Horizon 2019 ran the camp for children up to 25 years of age. New trustees were recruited and this allowed Kids Care to continue to run their vital service and ensure there was a space for every child with a disability, with no restrictions, to enjoy the summer of a lifetime.

The organisation reported that camp ran to a high standard with positive feedback from parents. Children enjoyed themselves tremendously, many of them wait all year round for camp, and benefitted immensely from the experience. Between morning carnivals and evening campfires in the daily program, children became artists, swimmers, athletes, actors on stage, adventurers, and, most importantly friends. Our campers formed a unique community, living alongside other kids coping with similar challenges. With the support of both counsellors and roommates, kids discovered they are capable of doing things they never dreamt possible.

Response from all year round care providers was overwhelmingly positive. They commented on the children's desire and confidence to try new things, their developed self-esteem, independence and capabilities. We hope that this will lead to bigger things, with the adolescents becoming more self-sufficient, going out to work, and being less reliant on the community at large.

Risk Management:

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risk to which the charity is exposed, and to ensure appropriate measures

are in place to mitigate any risks.

Reserves Policy:

The trustees retain reserves as necessary to maintain the operational capability of the Charity.



Responsibilities of the Trustees:

Charity Law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the Balance Sheet Date, and of its incoming resources, including income and expenditure for the financial year.

In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees should follow best practice and:

- a. Select suitable accounting policies and the apply them consistently.
- b. Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- c. Follow applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP October 2005, updated May 2008 disclosing and explaining any departures in the financial statements.
- d. Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them as Trustees to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charity Law. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other regularities.

1) Principal Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the Charities Act (Accounts and Reports) 2011, and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities 102, and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting By Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (effective from April 2015).

Cash Flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the charity as a small reporting entity is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement.

Donations and Fund Accounting

Donations received for the general and main purposes of the Charity is included as unrestricted funds in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

Donations and Grants for activities restricted by the donors are taken to restricted funds if the wishes and conditions of the donor are legally binding on the Trustees.

Resources Expended

Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

The irrecoverable element of VAT is included with the item of expense to which it relates.

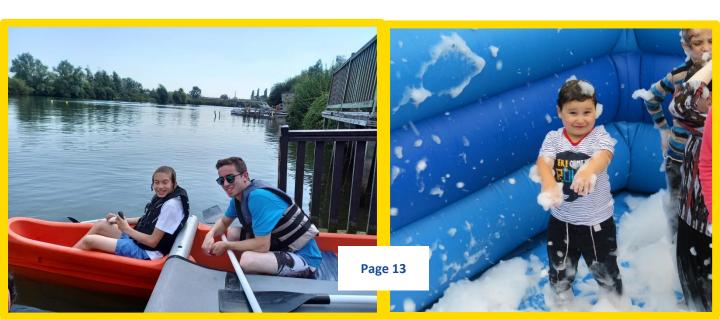

Accountants Report to the Trustees on the Unaudited Accounts of the Charity Kids Care London

We report on the financial statements of Kids Care London, for the year ended 30 November 2019 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting By Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (Issued 2015), and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities 102 (effective 2016), and the accounting policies set out therein.

Respective Responsibilities Of Trustees and Reporting Accountants

As described on page 5, the trustees of the charity are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, and they consider that the audit requirement of section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) does not apply. It is our responsibility to state, on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 144 of the Act, whether particular matters have come to our attention.

Basis of Accountant's Report
