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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principal object of the charity is to relieve the needs of children and young people, adults and families living in North Tyneside and the surrounding area who have suffered from and/or are likely to suffer from violence in their homes in particular by the provision of support services and advice to relieve those needs.

Our Vision:

Acorns seeks to reduce the incidence and impact of domestic violence and sexual abuse on children, young people, adults and families by offering a range of services to support and sustain their recovery.

Our Aims:

We will safeguard and promote the safety, welfare and rights of children, young people and their families who have suffered from violence and abuse within their home. We will:

Improve future life chances and aspirations

Develop new services in line with the needs of individuals and families which improve their lives

Review and improve services through stakeholder consultation

Ensure all services delivered are of high quality, effective and efficient

Work in partnership with individuals and families

Significant activities

For almost 20 years, Acorns has been providing much valued services to victims and survivors of domestic violence aged 4 to 18 in the heart of North Tyneside. Acorns specialise in play therapy and one to one trauma informed counselling services, as well as offering parent and carer support, group work, prevention and healthy relationships work in schools and colleges, and one to one outreach support both at school and in the community.

Public benefit

Acorns works with victims and survivors of domestic and sexual violence of all ages towards achieving positive outcomes. Specialist services have been developed to tackle the incidence and impact of domestic and sexual violence and abuse by improving safety, improving mental and physical health, increasing self-esteem and confidence and thereby increasing individual and family life chances. Information is effectively promoted to partner agencies and within the community to ensure services reach those in the greatest need and with particular focus on safeguarding children, young people and adults at risk of harm.

The trustees consider that they comply with their duty in Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit.

Volunteers

Acorns holds volunteers in high regard for their contributions at all levels of the organisation. This includes trustee duties, fundraising and individual and group peer support.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Context and background

Acorns is a North Tyneside based charitable organisation established to provide therapeutic and support services to children affected by domestic violence and support for families and non-abusing carers. Based in North Shields, we provide services to families in North Tyneside and Northumberland and work closely with other organisations to extend and compliment the services offered to children and families. Acorns provides its services free and delivers contracts and receives grants from a variety of sources.

The ethos of Acorns is 'Safer Lives, Better Chances'. This is fundamental to our work and inbuilt within all of our services for children and families. We aim to empower them in an empathic, person centred approach and through raising their awareness and confidence, to make informed choices in their own future and their future relationships.

Acorns has significant experience of delivering domestic violence services in North Tyneside and of developing and maintaining services to meet ongoing client need. We have offered children and young people's counselling and play therapy services since 1999. We recognise the need to work with non-abusing carers to offer a whole family approach to tackling the impact of domestic and sexual violence and abuse on individuals and families.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

We have three service areas at Acorns:

PREVENT: Our Prevent and Cope team provide various services including a text helpline, a bespoke healthy relationship programme for young people aged 11+, as well as offering a range of training opportunities and support for professionals, awareness sessions for groups of young people and small single sex group work for those identified as at risk and/or vulnerable. This work aims to reduce and/or **PREVENT** the likelihood of domestic and sexual violence and abuse in the future.

COPE: Our Prevent and Cope team offer support to help **COPE** with current circumstances. The primary aim is to risk assess and safety plan with the child/young person by helping the child/young person to help them to identify supportive and safe people in their lives as well as offering listening and emotional support on a case work basis and advocacy where needed.

RECOVER: Acorns Recovery team and Outreach service offers one to one emotional support, play therapy and counselling for children and young people and their primary carers to help them **RECOVER** from the effects of domestic and sexual violence and abuse on their physical, psychological and emotional health and wellbeing.

Our work in 2019/20:

Tier 1 - Prevent

Open access advice and guidance flexible drop-in service for young people worried about teen relationship abuse, or domestic abuse at home;

Text helpline;

Set timetable of prevention programmes in schools;

One off group sessions in schools where a need is identified;

Partnership working including participating in the Domestic Abuse Champion network, the NT Domestic Abuse Partnership and working closely with Police operations to improve safety within communities.

Tier 2 - Cope

Risk and safety planning - helping the child/young person to identify supportive and safe people in their lives as well as developing strategies to stay safe;

Emotional support - a lower level of therapeutic intervention suitable for children and young people who are struggling with current life events but may not be in a position to commit to a structured programme of counselling;

Advocacy - support at meetings and appointments if necessary, with court or within school for example, for both young people and for primary carers;

Practical advice and guidance and mentoring - around future choices and decisions, education, employment, mental and physical health, etc.

Where a child has been identified as needing counselling, we can offer a lower level of support until a place becomes available, ensuring they have someone to talk to in the meantime.

Tier 3 - Recover

Counselling and play therapy in house;

Outreach counselling and play therapy in Northumberland;

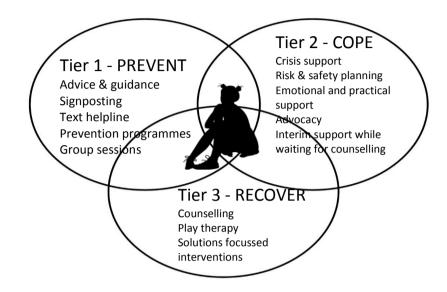
Play therapy and solutions focussed interventions in schools and the community;

1-1 emotional and practical support on a case work basis;

Family Advice Worker for any non-abusing carer whose child attends Acorns, offering practical and emotional support; Adult counselling service as above.

Families can access any of our services that are appropriate for them, they may move in and out of services, and can be re-referred. All services remain free.

Services:

The children and young people that use our services say:

"Thank you for all the help you have given me over the last couple of months. The support you have offered has meant so much. Thank you so much for everything"

"I have been able to get all my stress and worries out so that I can feel better"

"When I have needed to talk you've helped me through my toughest times and when going through it. You have been the best support I have ever had."

Go back 2 years and I don't think I would have been able to deal with the half the stuff I have this year without completely breaking down and relying on everyone around me. Improving the lives of people that use our services

This year we received positive feedback from children, young people, families and professionals which highlights the importance of our services and how they are delivered. We:

Offered circa 1700 individual sessions;

Increased capacity within all of our services;

Continued delivering open access and crisis services for children and young people;

Our Family Support Worker supported 41 parents/carers;

We delivered x2 4Real healthy relationships programmes for a girls group and a boys group, in Southlands School;

We delivered our Roots programme of intervention in North Shields Refuge in partnership with Harbour;

We delivered our First Response crisis support programme, and supported 40 individual young people;

We commenced our Adult Counselling project, funded through CCG Small Grants Programme; Provided 'added value' activities for parents and carers such as access to trips and activities and coffee mornings, including:

Acorns Summer Fun Day;

Summer holiday activities including golf, surfing, cinema trips and stay and play sessions;

Charity Golf Day:

SAFE Week Coffee Morning;

Domestic Abuse Week Open Day;

Christmas Crafts session;

Acorns Christmas Party;

International Women's Day Coffee Morning;

Joint International Women's Day event with partners;

Financial stability

We successfully managed all of our existing contracts and grants, reaching targets and milestones as required, including work funded by the National Lottery Community Fund, North Tyneside Council, Northumberland County Council and Children in Need. We secured further funding from:

National Lottery Community Fund Awards for All, to provide a weekly sports and wellbeing group for all children who access Acorns and their family members;

Northumberland County Council; who have continued to fund our Outreach Recovery service, which brings counselling to children in even the most rural areas of the county;

The Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland; who continue to fund our Roots programme, a wellbeing and recovery programme for children aged 8-12;

Northumbria Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner; who continue to fund our successful First Response crisis service for children and young people aged 11+;

We were funded by North Tyneside CCG Small Grants Programme to provide a counselling service for parents and carers in house and this is now up and running;

We were very grateful to receive additional grants from:

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

We would like to thank all of the amazing organisations that fund us for all of your support.

We raised almost £7000 from fundraising and donations, including holding a Charity Golf Day in partnership with Tynemouth Golf Club, and holding a raffle. We have received donations from local businesses and organisations including the Rotary Club, Ruby & Franks and North Tyneside Family Services, and government sites at Tyne View and Benton View donated hundreds of pounds' worth of Christmas presents that were given out to our families. Again, we very much appreciate all of the support we receive from our community in North Tyneside.

Networking and information sharing

We contributed to LSCB Domestic Abuse awareness training held quarterly and contributed to the DAPS Level 2 Domestic Abuse training;

We provided training and information sharing for professionals to improve professional responses for young victims of domestic and sexual violence and abuse and including a focus on teen relationship violence and abuse;

We promoted Domestic Abuse week - delivering a focussed programme of information events including an open day for professionals and families, and Safe Week;

We regularly attend local meetings and forums such as the Domestic Abuse Champions Forum, the North Tyneside Domestic Abuse Partnership, and the Domestic Abuse Scrutiny Panel.

Strengthening the organisation

Training

All new and current staff completed appropriate Child and Adult Protection training as required, as well as other sector specific training as needed including around coercive control, Adolescent to Parent violence and abuse, and cyber stalking and harassment;

All staff undertook the TIME (Trauma Informed Model of Empowerment) Training delivered by My Sister's Place in January, and we continue to work with them to develop a Trauma Informed action plan for services moving forward;

Regular in house team training for all staff was provided including on health and safety and data protection;

Ongoing continuous professional development for counselling staff was undertaken as required by BACP:

The current Board are passionate about the work of Acorns and service improvement, and hope to continue to grow and add further new members to complement the current knowledge within the group, including developing the role for a service user representative. The Board have been meeting monthly throughout the year, which demonstrates their commitment to Acorns.

Organisational development

In this period we have:

Replaced a paper based system with an electronic case management system, with full reporting capabilities;

Improved IT and HR provision;

Secured over £350,000 of grant funding and contracts;

Expanded services into Northumberland;

Completed a staff consultation - implementing a new salary scale, organisational structure, contract terms and conditions and role descriptions;

Implemented the CORE IMS clinical monitoring system in order to better evidence improvements in client wellbeing;

Moved from Excel based financial recording to Quickbooks, an accounting software package.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have explored the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. The aim is to build up unrestricted funds representing at least three months of the charity's normal expenditure. The reserves are needed to meet the working capital requirements of the charity in order to maintain the charity's current activities. The present level of reserves available to the charity of £116,900 meets this target level.

Financial position

Incoming resources in the period were £288,110. Of this amount £160,031 related to restricted project activities.

There was a surplus of £720 in the period. At 31 March 2020 total reserves were £144,342 of which restricted funds were £27,442 and £116,900 of unrestricted.

Acorns could not carry out the work that it does without the generous support of its funders and contractors, details of whom are shown in Note 3 to these Financial Statements. We are grateful to them all.

FUTURE PLANS

We have been trained as a trauma informed organisation, and will be reviewing and improving our services accordingly, with work on a comprehensive action plan for this planned for June 2020.

We wish to offer systemic family therapy, attachment groups and psychodynamic education for the families who come to Acorns, and will be seeking funding accordingly.

We are focussing strongly on service user participation in 20/21, with plans for a Young People's Board, and a service user representative on the Board of Trustees. In addition, we have secured funding to provide a weekly youth/sports and wellbeing group for children who have attended Acorns for them to stay connected to a stable, regular form of support when their more intensive interventions have come to an end. This will also encourage peer support, and allow us to monitor the lasting effects of our interventions in a positive and motivating way.

We have commissioned an independent evaluation of our services as part of the final year of our National Lottery grant, and are really looking forward to using this process as a way to engage more meaningfully with service users. The recommendations from this report will be used to inform future funding applications and service improvements.

As we come to the end of this financial year, we are aware that the coronavirus pandemic will have a considerable impact on the way that we deliver our services and on our waiting lists, and we have begun to plan for the mitigation of this, including increasing staff resources where possible, and considering extending our premises to manage the extra work which will may ensue, when considering the potential for domestic abuse incidents to increase at such an uncertain time.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Acorns (North Tyneside) is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 9th January 2014 and registered as a charity on 16th May 2014. The company was established under a Memorandum and Articles of Association establishing the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees consist of at least two and not more than 10 individuals over the age of 18 all of whom must support the objects of the charity. The trustees are elected on a rolling basis at Board Meetings.

Organisational structure

The charity and its property is administered and managed by the trustees in accordance with the Memorandum, the Articles and the Companies Act.

Induction and training of new trustees

New Trustees meet with the Chief Officer and the Board who provide them with a comprehensive introduction to the workings and ethos of Acorns. They receive the charitable status handbook, a copy of the Articles and the last published Financial Statements and are offered training in areas where they perceive they may have weaknesses.

Working relationships

We work closely with the local authority domestic abuse teams, children's services and with Harbour, Victims First and local schools and colleges to support families affected by domestic abuse. We feed into MARAC and are members of the North Tyneside Domestic Abuse Partnership, and are involved with the Domestic Abuse Champions scheme. The Manager attends the Northumbria OPCC Domestic Abuse Scrutiny Panel.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
