Structure: CIO it is managed by a voluntary management committee who are made up of local people, some of which are professional practitioners who feel passionate about the ethos of our charity. The committee is made up of a chair, vice chair, secretary and treasurer. We meet up quarterly to discuss policies, practices and project development. We have a safe guarding and child protection lead that is the chair. As a developing charity, we are embedding charity governance and quality assurance systems to improve our delivery.

Young people are actively at the core of our decision making. Having adapted our constitution 13th January 2017, we are keen to develop early intervention work with the community and have broadened our reach to include children, young people and their families, in compliance with the Waltham Forest local authority Think Family strategy.

Break Tha Cycle have a safer recruitment policy which we adhered to. Anyone who volunteers for us either as a trustee or to help with the day to day running of the charity will have to fill out an application form, be interviewed; DBS checked and then have for an induction. As part of the recruitment process two references must be produced and followed up, then interviewed to find out what their key motivation is to work with children, young people and their families. Volunteers are offered supervision and one to one session to monitor and support their volunteering experience.

Projects:

The Bewizer - St James Street

Funded by the Big Local (Lottery) following from the pilot project structured for vulnerable young boys who are at risk of exclusion from school and who were disengaged. The project was a 12-week targeted programme delivered weekly tackling some of the serious issues that are affecting young boys who attend the Big Creative Education (BCE).
