#### Objectives and activities

#### Summary of the purposes of the charity set out in its governing document

The objects are; to advance the education of the public in general about the issues relating to refugees and those seeking asylum; to advance the education and training of those seeking asylum and those granted refugee status and their dependents in need thereof so as to advance them in life and assist them to adapt within a new community; the promotion of equality and diversity for the public benefit by promoting activities to foster understanding between people from diverse backgrounds.

Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts

Welcome to York programme brings refugees from the region to York, hosted by local people for a day. They are introduced to the heritage and history of the city, and meet people from diverse backgrounds. Compass programme gathers household goods, and clothes to assist local and regionally based refugees and asylum seekers as they enter and adapt within a new community. ESOL services provides English classes at city locations and in homes of refugees. This advances their education in their life in the new community. Advocacy Services provides advice and financial aid, to assist asylum seekers and refugees to access legal support needed to advance their life, and educates them in applications for housing, benefits, student loans. Public Engagements provide presentations in Schools, Universities, Faith communities, Civic occasions, and at voluntary organisations. The public in general are educated about issues relating to refugees and those

The trustees consider that they have complied with their duties to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.

#### Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.

The Board of Trustees met 7 times during the year. A feature of meetings has been the inclusion of team leaders and administrative assistant to attend in a non voting capacity. They participated in discussions on developing a business and strategy plan for 2020 onwards. From November 2019, the Board commissioned a full evaluation of our work. This was carried out by students from the Centre for Applied Human Rights at the University of York. All projects and activities undertaken by our Charity were scrutinized and a full report was published in March 2020. Recommendations will be discussed by the Board. The 'Welcome to York' programme welcomed refugees and asylum seekers from Hull, Wakefield, Bradford, Teesside, Richmond and Ripon. A total of 219 people came to enjoy hospitality and friendship which our team of hosts provided. **Following** the award of University of Sanctuary status to York St. John University, designated Board members are working with the University of York to prepare their application for Sanctuary status. We are looking to expand the Sanctuary movement's culture of welcome and hospitality to schools and colleges of Further education in the city. A pilot project working with Oxfam shop, trained 4 refugees to work in 3 shops. Other volunteers and staff took part in training sessions to explore issues of migration, and Refugee Week publicity was displayed in the shops. Plans are in hand to avalore developing the scheme The Compact programme collected clothing household goods

#### Financial review
