

THE STOUR BLUE WATER PASS TRUST Registered Charity No 1180421

The charity was unable to fulfil any activities throughout the 2020 sailing season as a result of the Covid 19 pandemic. The sole activity for the financial year (2019/20), in the autumn of 2019, was to provide an opportunity for one young person aboard a Cirdan Trust vessel on a five day residential sailing course.

Trustees agreed, immediately prior to commencement of the 2020 season, that it would not be possible to commence service delivery until the 'COVID Alert Level' (in accordance with HM Government Guidelines) fell to 2 or below. Level 2 deems that the number of infections is low, and none, or minimal, social distancing measures are in place. At the time of writing Level 5, the highest level of infection is indicated.

Trustees were mindful of their overriding responsibility not to provide activities that could lead to the risk of infection for participating young people or their parents. All sailing tuition, at this entry stage, by necessity, involves close proximity with the participants, and their instructors, using shared boats and shared safety equipment.

The Fire Station that acts as Operational Centre, providing changing facilities is not available to us while the pandemic is widespread and our RYA certification is dependant on its availability.

Operators of the residential sail training excursions that we had planned were prohibited by law from offering trips and other third party commissions we had planned were suspended.

The charity was successful in attracting charitable grants and contributions from grant making organisations and others including the Essex Community Foundation, The Mistley Maltings Trust, Vanguard HealthCare, Trinity House Maritime Charity, the East of England Co-op and the Gannett Foundation, together with a number of individual donations. Income of over £32,000 was received.

Expenditure was just over £4,500 made up primarily of the costs of buying a second hand Optimist dinghy fleet, and a number of recurring overheads, including RYA subscription and online hosting.

Funds in excess of £30,000 are available to the charity with no present liabilities.

It is impossible to predict the environment or the restrictions that may remain present in 2021 and accordingly it is difficult at this stage to plan any programmes.

On resumption of activities the charity will focus initially on the sail training activities from Manningtree that will require access to the Fire Station. Our senior sail instructor remains available and is able to re-engage others to support her.

Government directions and safety considerations will determine the parameters and level of our re-engagement with our target audience of young people to whom we remain fully committed to provide opportunity and fulfilment in the realisation of our charitable purpose. As soon as social distancing measures are reduced sufficiently we will consider a programme that can be safely and effectively delivered.
