Objectives & Activities

Our primary objective and stated public benefit is the prevention or relief of poverty in Hertfordshire and Essex in particular, but not exclusively, by providing emergency food supplies and related provisions to individuals in need, and to charities or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty. The Food Bank provides food for people in crisis, who have been identified and referred by front-line professional partnering agencies, by means of a voucher system. Additionally, we seek to signpost people with underlying problems to appropriate specialist supporting agencies.

Governance & Management

The Trustees meet regularly to oversee the running of the charity, and to ensure there is a robust decision making process. In delivering its objectives, the Trustees are aware of their responsibilities and seek to ensure the Food Bank is legislatively compliant, and that appropriate governance arrangements, procedures, and safeguards are in place. Trustees are recruited for the knowledge, skills, experience, and personal values they bring to the Charity. Trustees are encouraged to attend Training Courses offered by Community Voluntary Services for Broxbourne & East Herts, and to consult guidance for Trustees issued by the Charities Commission.

Operational

Bishops Stortford Food Bank operates as an independent charity, and is a member of the Independent Food Aid Network. However, the Food Bank works closely with our neighbouring Food Bank at Harlow, sharing warehouse facilities and transport capacity for example. Prior to the pandemic food was distributed at the Methodist Church in Bishops Stortford but since then has been distributed to clients own homes by a team of volunteer

drivers. In addition to a Coordinator, the Food Bank has recently taken on an Administrative Assistant to cope with increasing demand for food and more comprehensive requirements. Both employees are engaged on a part time basis and are supported by a bank of over 50 volunteers. We work with over 20 front line professional agencies. The food is provided to the Food Bank by donations from individuals, churches, schools and by means of collections at Supermarkets.

Financial

The accounts for the period ended 31st March 2020 have been produced on a Receipts and Payments basis. The Trustees have established a strategy to seek financial stability and, as part of that process, a Reserves Policy has been agreed to provide flexibility to meet foreseeable costs. The objective is to maintain minimum funds equivalent to 12 months operating costs to cover, in particular, risks to sources of donated income and possible significant increases in demand. We seek diversity of funding, this to include donations from individuals, businesses, churches, and community groups. A number of organised fund raising events are held and, where appropriate, applications are made to grant giving bodies.

Review

Since opening the Bishops Stortford Food Bank, we continue to be encouraged by the town's response to emergency local needs. Whether that support has been donating food items or money, promoting the work of the Food Bank, or volunteering to help, all these contributions ensured we have been able to provide food and assistance to all those referred to us. Our work engaging with local media, use of social media, and working with other charitable organisations in the area continues to raise awareness of people in poverty and of the role of the Food Bank in helping those in crisis. Our outreach work in local schools has helped us build useful partnerships, and we have held several 'open days' at the Food Bank for primary schools.

During the year to 31st March 2020 we provided 395 food boxes which fed 669 people as well as fresh produce and toiletries, nappies and cleaning products. In addition, we were able to provide a large number of Christmas 'hampers' to families distributed by the Salvation Army and to single people via the local YMCA. We also received a grant from Hertfordshire Community Foundation to help those in fuel poverty, and have distributed just under £1,000 people referred to us by partner agencies.

We wish to record our thanks to our employees, our dedicated group of volunteers and the many individuals, local businesses, supermarkets, churches, schools, professional and community organisations that have helped us enormously over the last 12 months.

We are fortunate to be provided a stable base at Bishop's Stortford Methodist Church, and we are grateful for the practical support the Church gives us in our work. In the future we look to working more closely with the Church, possibly on joint projects related to our work, and with them have been looking at how the environment of the Food Bank could be enhanced to meet our needs more effectively and enhance the experience of volunteers and clients there.

We remain focussed on our core objectives. This is to ensure anyone in poverty crisis knows of our existence and receives the food and other items that they need, and that they receive a warm welcome, a listening ear and where relevant practical assistance in signposting them to other specialist supporting agencies.
