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# Annual Report & Financial Statements 2019/20 Chairman's Report for year 2019/20

### AGM. BPFA 27<sup>th</sup> October 2020

Well what a year this has been for Bagshot Playing Fields and it's pavilion! Last year's chairman's report was full of aspirations. Now it is all done, despite COVID and all the myriad of problems thrown up by this.

We have a pavilion fit and flexible for the future. Our contractor-Able Contracts Ltd provided us with excellent workmanship and continued support throughout. They provided us with advice and help well beyond normal expectations and continued working when they could during lockdown. We now have modern toilets, an extra meeting room, new fire doors, an upgraded heating system, new lights and two store rooms as well as a disabled toilet. The whole interior is much more friendly and all has been redecorated

The maintenance of the grounds is an ongoing activity. Leaves are a big problem in the autumn and we have acquired a powerful leaf blower which is helping the task. We also had a number of work parties in the spring to clip encroaching vegetation especially brambles. My thanks to the volunteers of The Heathland Society who once work stops on the heath in late February kindly continued to be active on our behalf fora few weeks

We continue to spend well over £1000 a year keeping the hedge trimmed and other tree work as required. Windlesham Parish Council kindly provide us with some funding to help cover this with "an open-air grant" The small garden by the side of the Pavilion has changed out of all recognition and mostly due to the Herculean effort and enthusiasm of Linda King with input from Ken Cordaroy. Ken has also been a great help in various other tasks over the years

Curley Park Rangers continue to play on Saturday mornings. They have mobile football goals kept on the field padlocked when not in use

The Tennis Club continues to be very active and successful- so much so that a 5th court has now been built with plans for new netting and eventually new LED floodlights

Our central Hall has also been redecorated. Because of COVID it had a long spell not being used. We have lost some hirers but gained new ones. We have lost revenue but have been awarded some financial support to help us through as outlined in the treasurer's report. The future is bright.



I want to give special thanks to the committee who have worked like Trojans this year- at times almost full time it seemed.

Gill May who has negotiated with the contractors, who overlooks nothing and has achieved the impossible. Linda King who keeps everyone sane and among other things has almost single handed transformed the garden.

Jackie Burchall who has amongst other things planned the decoration, the layout of the Pavilion to cover virus regulations and found us all the necessary signage

Sue Curry who has continued to manage the letting of the pavilion with remarkable tolerance and patience. This has involved much negotiation with the renters, designing new contracts and risk assessments. Almost every day she is in the thick of things.

June Hunt keeps an eye on things with her fount of knowledge and experience.

Barbara Royle our magnificent treasurer whose report speaks for itself.

Peter Keeling and Bindi Roopra our supportive members providing useful advice.

Finally, Jim Weston our new tennis rep full of sound Southern Hemisphere good sense and know how on many things, not least social networking.

#### **Treasurers Report 2019/20**

For 2019/20, the Association had an operational deficit of £157,097, which includes the Pavilion refurbishment cost of £149,850. Excluding the exceptional Pavilion refurbishment costs, the operational deficit would have been £7,247.

The Pavilion refurbishment project, has been completed within this financial year and funded by very generous donations from:-

The National Lottery £50,000
Windlesham Parish Council £15,000
The Cooperative Society £2,604 (a further donation to follow)
Community Foundation Surrey £2,000
Hall Grove School £250
Waitrose £220
Individual Donations £1,545

#### Income

The income from all our lettings has suffered, with the lockdown of our facilities due to the Pandemic, which we could not have predicted. Our regular income has reduced by £8,565 over last year and this will continue to be the case, until the current situation improves greatly. However, as our facilities are now much improved, we are optimistic that we will soon attract new clubs & hirers as soon as the restrictions are lifted.

#### **Open Areas**

More money was spent on maintaining the trees than last year and work carried out to the area around the Pavilion, has significantly improved the garden.

#### **Pavilion and Other Expenditure**

Running costs for the Pavilion increased by £2,767, due to extra maintenance work in the hall, which were not part of the building project and new fire doors required, that were covered on an insurance claim. All other costs were lower or in line with last year.

#### **Grants and Donations**

As ever, we are grateful to Windlesham Parish Council for support to our Open Areas of £957 this year.

The very generous donations to the Pavilion Building/Refurbishment project are listed above.

We have also received grants of £10,000 from Surrey Heath Borough Council and £6,930 from Sport England, to help with the running costs of the Pavilion. These grants are restricted to costs such as utilities and rent, which the BPFA would struggle to pay, due to the lack of income in the current climate.
