Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The objects of the CIO are: to promote the arts and the education of the public by providing musical performances, lecture recitals and workshops, information, a forum and other facilities in respect of unusual historical instruments, for as wide an audience as possible.

Between the May 1, 2019 and April 30, 2020, the work of The Society of Strange and Ancient Instruments (SSAI) has been devoted to the development of The Trumpet Marine Project. Like many arts organisations, our activities have been curtailed by COVID 19 and the resulting restrictions. However, we have still managed to work on and develop the project, produce a 'docu-concert' for Brighton Early Music Festival (streamed in October 2020) and to make best use of the grants awarded before and during the reporting period.

Activity during the reporting period has been focussed on the preparation of The Trumpet Marine Project. This includes the commission of three new instruments and research and development sessions to learn to play them in ensemble. This long-term project generates new information, entertainment and educational events and a practical resource, which will be made available to a wide audience. The original proposal of at least 20 live performances has been adjusted. Three performances are still planned for 2021 but work will now be focussed on the creation of an in-depth website about the project to ensure its legacy and dissemination. This project promises to shed light on wider issues of performance in Early Music, inspiring new approaches to the performance of 17th and 18th century music.

These activities satisfy the objects of the CIO in promoting the arts and education of the public by providing performances and workshops, alongside a forum (website and social media) in respect of unusual historical instruments. SSAI's social media presence and informative newsletter continue to reach a large and diverse audience.

The trustees are aware of the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit and are satisfied that the activities of The Society of Strange and Ancient Instruments meet the criteria set out therein.
