Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Brighton & Hove U3A

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 July 2020 which are set out on pages 2 to 3.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and Independent Examiner.

The Charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the Accounts. They consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) although an examination is required by the Charity's Constitution.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in a full audit, and consequently, no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
