CHAIR'S REPORT FOR 2020

Our objectives for the past year were threefold:

- 1. To plan a continued program of low risk fundraising events subject to Government
- 2. To progress the new kitchen build & fixtures
- 3. To re-establish our award status and membership of ACRE

The year 2020 proved to be probably the most challenging in the Hall's history due to the pandemic and a national lockdown which commenced on 16^{th} March and lasted until July when we embarked on a phased reopening. The restrictions continued to ease for a few months as Kent was fortunately placed in Tier 1 which permitted exercise and sports groups to come back. We even held a fundraising Bingo evening on 10^{th} October which proved popular raising approximately £300.

During the closure period the premises, on the advice of our insurers and ACRE, was fully maintained both internally and externally. Procedures and processes were also developed to make the building Covid secure. As we're now in full lockdown again the hall is again essentially closed but we're in a high state of readiness for when the situation eases.

FINANCE – The audited accounts for the financial period ending 30th September 2020 shows a positive bank balance of £19,597 helped largely by a £10,000 Small Business Grant and more recently a smaller amount of £1,500 from the government. Considerable expenditure took place on the build of the new kitchen and equipment. The treasurer will expand.

FUND RAISING & GRANTS – Apart from one Bingo evening last October we've been unable to hold any further events and of course the regular income from hirings has been severely affected. What has been beneficial though was the agreement from Tenterden Town Council to freeze our loan repayments.

PUBLIC RELATIONS. Our bespoke website www.stmichaelsvillagehall.org has been operational for about 3 years now. Since launch I have continued to keep the site updated along with the rest of our social media platforms. Social media continues to be crucial to the generation of bookings and provides positive PR for the Hall as is the publication of Hall Aid. An 8 page edition was printed last Spring however, due to Covid 19 restrictions, distribution to all households was delayed to July

TRUSTEES & ROLES – During the year Emma was enlisted as a trustee and has now assumed the role of Treasurer. She operates from home on a PC kindly donated to the Hall by Catherines employer. Potentially this PC could be used to monitor and log all of our compliance obligations as a charity as well as the book keeping

Pam Smith a valued Trustee resigned from the committee midyear but, when Covid regulations permit is happy to continue to support the Hall with fund raising

THANKS – Once again thank you to all my fellow trustees and supporters for their individual & collective efforts throughout the year. I'd also like to pay tribute to Trevor Bingham of Arts Inc for donating his design skills in particular the composition of "Hall Aid" and our various posters.

Importantly, we mustn't become complacent. The Village Hall has indisputably become St Michaels' biggest Community asset and as custodians of this asset our key priorities going forward should be:

- 1. To finalise the new kitchen with additional equipment and security shutters
- 2. To revisit the Refurbishment Master Plan and assess how this should be progressed
