PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The provision of a first-class childcare and nursery facility, for children aged 3 months to 5 years old in the Reading area. By charging a competitive fee, we hope to make this facility available to parents and children who would not normally have access to nursery education.

READING EARLY YEARS QUALITY SERVICE

We acknowledge the important role which Reading Early Years Quality Services play in helping to improve the services we offered to the families who used our services. We particularly want to thank our Early Years Advisory Teachers and the Under 5's Advisory team for their dedication to the improvement of the setting. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

We would like to thank all those who have served on the Management committee during the year ended 31 March 2020. We appreciate that Committee involvement is challenging, nevertheless, it can be interesting and personally rewarding.

FINANCE

We regard the state of affairs of the Organisation's finances for the year to be unsatisfactory. There was a net deficit of Expenditure over income of £84,502, (2019: Surplus of £2,930). Members of the Management Committee are presently implementing a remedial action plan to reverse the adverse financial results, and ensure that the finances of the Organisation show surplus of income over expenditure in the near future.

THE MAPP PARTNERSHIP

We have defined the services that we run. We have worked on a cash flow projection to ensure long-term viability of the Nursery. We have been working closely with the Early Years Development and Childcare Partnership and look forward to becoming part of the Katesgrove virtual Children Centre, in order to achieve our goal of long-term viability. We look forward to offering a range of services with MAPP and Kategrove Children Centre over the next 12 months.
