# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Generation Builders is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), registered with the Charity Commission and governed by its constitution adopted January 2015.

The only voting members of the CIO are the charity trustees. Membership of the CIO cannot be transferred to anyone else. The members of the CIO have no liability to contribute to the assets and no personal responsibility for settling debts and liabilities in the event of winding up.

The affairs of the charity are managed by the trustees, who may exercise all the powers of the charity.

## TRUSTEES' REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

#### Appointment of trustees

The first charity trustees were appointed for a term of four years (Mr A Murray) and three years (remaining trustees). Future trustees will be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees. In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees will regard skill, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.

In accordance with the terms of the constitution, there must be at lease three charity trustees. Each new trustee is given a copy of the constitution and the latest trustees' annual report and accounts on or before appointment.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## Charitable aims and objectives

The objective of the CIO is to advance the Christian faith both in Great Britain and overseas for the benefit of the public in accordance with the beliefs found in the Christian Bible.

#### Activities

In shaping the objectives for the year, the trustees have paid due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.

2019 was the fifth full year of ministry for Generation Builders. We continued to strengthen our relationships with our existing connections as well as making new ones. Once again, nearly every week of the year saw a Generation Builders event taking place

The majority of our time was spent in the United Kingdom where we spoke at 34 different churches or events. These included local church meetings, conferences, community outreach events and specialist events for youth and church leaders.

In January, Generation Builders spent one week in the USA where Andrew spoke at the Road to Glory Conference. In February Generation Builders took a team to mainland Europe where they spoke in churches in Albania and at a conference in Spain. In May, Andrew spent two and a half weeks in USA, speaking at various churches, including several that were new connections for Generation Builders. In July Andrew spent a week in Mexico speaking at several conferences. In September, Andrew returned to the USA for two weeks speaking in several churches.

Our ministry in print and on radio and the release of new audio products continues to expand

We held our annual conference in Rotherham with a guest from the USA, Tracy Stewart

Mr Steven Senior stood down from the trustees board in January

#### Public benefit

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and complied with section 17(5) of the Charities Act when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our activities. ## FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees recognise the need to keep reserves at a level which will give the charity stability to enable is to continue to operate in the future. The actual level of reserves at the year end, represented by the unrestricted fund, was £8,633 (2018: £9,029) which the trustees consider to by satisfactory.

Financial position

The financial statements are set out on pages 6 to 8. The Receipts and Payments Account shows a deficit for the year of £396 (2018: Surplus £2,117). The total funds of the charity at the year end stood at £8,633 (2019: £9,029).

#### Post balance sheet events

A. Murray - Trustee

The Covid-19 pandemic in 2020 has obviously effected charities around the world and Generation Builders has been no different.

Since March the vast majority of our in-person events have been cancelled as have all of our overseas missions trips.

We have however focused a lot on-line during this season, speaking at various church events through prerecordings and also live internet broadcasts.

Financially, we have had some one-off donations and income from products and on-line recordings that we have done. However, our regular income has been greatly reduced this year due to the cancellation of most of our events. Thankfully we have had a healthy surplus in the accounts and also with no travel, our expenses have also been minimal. Regular payments to our free lance staff have been adjusted accordingly to take into account the reduction in events. Overall, we have never been concerned about finances throughout the year.

Looking ahead in 2021, we expect a slow start to the year with pace picking up in the second half of the year. With continued financial prudence we don't have any concerns over the charity and the long term future shouldn't be any different.

As all of our events have been on-line, Covid security / social distancing etc hasn't been something that we have needed to worry about.

It has been a slow year but manageable and we have no long term concerns.
