Annual Report 2020

Aims and Objectives of the Trust

- (1) The advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith primarily, but not exclusively within Nuneaton and the surrounding neighbourhood. The Basis of Faith is defined by the Nicene Creed, as reproduced in the Appendix below.
- (2) Such other charitable purposes as shall, in the opinion of the Managing Trustees further the work of the Church.

Structure, Governance and Management

Responsibility for management of the Trust is shared between the Holding Trustee and the Management Trustees. Their functions are explained below.

The function of the Holding Trustee is to hold the legal title of real property and investments belonging to the Church and to ensure that the same is used only in furtherance of the purposes of the Church as set out in the Objectives of the Trust. The Holding Trustee must act in accordance with all lawful instructions of the Managing Trustees, unless to do so would give rise to a breach of trust.

The Managing Trustees of the Church are the persons appointed as church officers in accordance with the Church Rules. Their functions are defined in the Trust Document and include employment of staff, acquisition or disposal of property and to operate bank or building society accounts in the name of the Church. There shall not be less than 3 Managing Trustees.

The <u>Holding Trustee</u> is The Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches Limited.

Appointment of Managing Trustees is by invitation of the existing Trustees. To be appointed, the existing Managing Trustees must unanimously support the application of the proposed incoming Managing Trustee.

Full details of the principles by which the Trust is governed are listed in the Nuneaton Christian Fellowship Church Constitution and Rules. A copy can be obtained on request to the Chairman.

Strategies

The work of the Trust has continued to develop, in line with our aims of Christian worship and service. Nuneaton Christian Fellowship continues to have involvement with the work of Nuneaton Christian Network and continues as a member of the Evangelical Alliance. The Church's affiliation to Elim Churches Incorporated has also continued. The Federation of Independent Evangelical Churches (FIEC) holds the NCF Church Centre in Trust on behalf of NCF Trust. The FIEC has registered the NCF building in the name of Nuneaton Christian Fellowship.

Aims for Current Year

- 1. To function and operate all church activities and since March 2020 in accordance with Government and Elim guidelines
- 2. Facilitate the new Pastor in overseeing and co-ordinating roles in the Fellowship.
- 3. Encourage Bible study, prayer and worship in the life of the fellowship, using a computer application(Zoom) from March 2020 to facilitate this
- 4. Strengthen the life of the fellowship, by encouraging fellowship groups and maintaining support structures as part of the life of the Fellowship using the computer application Zoom to facilitate this from March 2020.
- 5. Strengthen the life of the fellowship by developing of links with those outside the local Christian community in accordance with Governmental and Elim guidelines since March 2020.
- 6. Encourage outreach in word and action, which is both visible and relevant to the local community.

7. To look for church growth through prayer and evangelistic outreach onto the local estate and the new build estates which are being built around us as Covid restrictions allow since March 2020.

Activities undertaken during the year

Unfortunately, activities within the Church Centre have been significantly limited since March 2020 due to the Covid 19 pandemic and the subsequent series of 'Lockdowns' experienced by all in this country. From March- May 2020 part of the church met regularly for worship on Sunday mornings 'remotely' using the 'Zoom' application accessible on-line. Unfortunately, this has not been open to all of the congregation because some people do not own computers to access Zoom. John, our minister, made sure that those with no computers were offered the opportunity to join by telephone and took them a step by step guide of how to do it. Pleasingly this offer was taken up by some. On Zoom, there is a regular adult teaching programme, which has included teaching by a number of visiting speakers. There has been no children's group in operation during this time and neither has there been an evening 'traditional style' service presently both having been stopped in March 2020 when the services moved to Zoom. Prior to that there was a full weekly programme.

.NCF's worship during the Sunday services has been led by the Minister John Stephenson. During the first lockdown he played live on his keyboard at home via Zoom

The new minister continued to communicate with the fellowship through the medium of the NCF website and twice monthly editions of the church 'Onward' magazine. Some of the congregation received a paper copy of this delivered by John whilst others received their Onward on-line. John also produced a weekly Tuesday e-mail which gave information for prayers, notices and links to the previous Zoom services and current links to get onto Sunday services, prayer meetings and Bible studies via Zoom or telephone. Many people found this extremely useful.

There were some fifteen prayer walks arranged and conducted by the minister prior to the start of the pandemic covering the estate we are on and some of the new estates that are being built around us.

Members of our congregation have attended and continue to attend the prayer meeting at the local hospital. However this has been limited to occasional prayer meetings during the pandemic. Our full-time pastor has retired (January 2020) whilst our minister in training has continued studying with Elim looking to be ordained in 2021. He continues to supervise development and activity within the Fellowship. He is working closely with other leaders and partners to continue to develop their roles as co-ordinators, facilitators and pastor-teachers.

Achievements and Performance

Advancement of the Christian faith

The fortnightly Thursday afternoon luncheon club and fellowship / outreach meeting, named "Outlook" had continued. Outlook is an open meeting, run by NCF for the benefit of local residents. In addition, our previous full-time Pastor and his wife have continued to host a Friday afternoon social gathering whnich has also become more popular. The meeting is known as the "Minister's Tea Party", and is open to local residents. Both were suspended in March 2020 due to the lockdown and have not reopened.

Several days of 'reading through the Scriptures' were held during the year and were open to the public to attend. These were well attended.

Several of our church young people took part in young people's outreach events during the year, organised by the Wildfire group from Youth with a Mission (YWAM).

A church away day was held at a local Baptist church in November 2019 and was very well attended with an international speaker booked for the day

Other charitable work

The following secular groups have continued to use the NCF Church Centre during the week to reach out to people in the local community. Each of these meetings is attended by one or more church members. These include an Alzheimer's group run by Age Concern, a bereavement counselling group run by a local Undertakers. The local Rainbows, Brownies and Guides also hold their weekly meeting in the Church Centre and the local Women's Institute meet once a month. A charitable theatre and social group also meet quarterly.

A Baby Sensory Group now meets with 3 sessions on a Wednesday morning each attended by twenty parents with their 0-4 year old babies. This has proved very popular in the community and they currently have a waiting list. Also during the year the local NHS clinic have started to hold weekly health check clinics for young babies.

Each group partners with NCF in using the Church Centre; making a contribution to expenses. Again these were all suspended in March and will look to reopen when government and Elim guidance allows.

The kitchen was used regularly for the preparation and serving of meals for the benefit of the Church and the local community. The fortnightly church luncheon club has continued to be popular with local residents. A local chef had cooked meals for the club on a voluntary basis. Suspended in March 2020 and will look to reopen when government and Elim guidance allows.

Plans for future developments

- Further regular evening church outreach events are planned.
- A structured church prayer programme during 2020/21 is planned, which may include a prayer weekend.
- A new estate is being built close to the church and the programme of evangelistic outreach to the new residents is continuing with leaflets having been distributed.
- A programme to develop the Young People's work further and to attract younger couples into the church is being developed by our newly appointed "Minister in Training" during 2020/21 with a Friday night youth group being continued
