Working with other Agencies:

Furness Carers has a close and established working relationship with the other Carers organisations within Cumbria and in 2014 as partners formed a consortium, Carers Support Cumbria. We also have established close working relationships with Cumbria County Council, Lancashire and South Cumbria NHS Foundation Trust and are an active part of key groups looking at delivery of services to support unpaid Carers in Cumbria. We are an active and respected organisation who works with other 3rd sector organisations in the pursuit of supporting Carers and improving our wider community.

During this report period Furness Carers was a member of Carers UK.

Departmental Reports:

All Aged Carers Support Services:

Following the start of a new contract in October 2018, the organisation needed to undertake a restructure to ensure it would be able to operate within the reduced budget it would be receiving. This resulted in a staff and operational restructure and some staff redundancies.

From May 2019, all Carers support services came under one department, All Aged Carers Support Services, however we still delivered services directly to Adult and Young Carers and each had dedicated staff to support this work.

Adult & Parent Carers Support: During this financial year our work with Adult and Parent Carers delivered 3,010 breaks/services to Carers and completed 400 new Carer Assessments, 461 Carer Reviews and supported 2,041 Adult Carers during the period. 1,445 Volunteer hours were delivered giving a monetary value of £12,427 towards supporting our work.

To deliver these services we have five Carers Support Advisers, a part-time Carers Health Co-ordination Worker who's responsibility is to work with health professionals and their teams, a part-time Volunteer Support Worker with a dedicated team of 20 Volunteers.

Our Volunteer team have been actively involved supporting our objectives supporting Carers through our Carer Support Groups, sitting service, Carers Awareness Events, fundraising and at five monthly Carer Cafés held throughout the Furness area.

This area of work for the twelve-month period has been funded via contract from Carers Support Cumbria (Cumbria County Council), The Big Lottery Community Fund and donations.

Young Carers Support: The transition of the changes done with the restructure impacted on this area of our work most however the team continued deliver support to Young Carers with Young Carer Assessments, Young Carer Reviews, providing

100 after-school groups, ran school holiday activity programmes during Easter, summer and half-term holidays, over 200 Young Carers were registered with us during this period.

To deliver these services we have a team of two part-time Young Carers sessional staff and two Young Carers Support Workers.

This area of our work is funded via a contract and grants from Carers Support Cumbria (Cumbria County Council), Cumbria County Council, Sir John Fisher Foundation and number of other smaller grant awards and donations.

Our All Aged Carers Support Services are overseen and managed by our Carers Support Services Manager.

Administration Support:

The Board of Trustees, Chief Executive Officer and departmental teams are supported by our administration team.

We have one part-time administrator who is managed by the Chief Executive Officer.

Our bookkeeping activities are outsourced to our accountant, J F Hornby & Co.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The nature of the Charity's activities with variable income streams, and what are essentially fixed expenditure commitments, means that the Trustees need to maintain a significant level of reserves to meet any funding shortfall. In order to allow the Charity to be managed effectively, the Trustees have concluded that it is necessary to maintain a General Fund equivalent to approximately six months' expenditure, plus statutory redundancy pay. At 31st March 2020, this would amount to £168,730 compared to the balance fund of £73,309 (2019: £219,890).

The Trustees are currently trying to ascertain ways to meet this shortfall.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The company is incorporated under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The company was incorporated on 28th February 2006 and commenced trade on 1 April 2006, on which date it acquired the assets, liabilities and operations of the previous charitable organisation Furness Carers Association (Charity Number 1041169).

The company is a charitable company limited by guarantee, its Trustees being the Directors.

Trustees

The Board of Trustees is the ultimate responsible body of the organisation and meets regularly throughout the year to decide on strategies, and to exercise management and financial oversight of the Charity. The Trustees are also the Directors for the purpose of company law.

None of the Trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

Day to Day Management

The day to day activities are organised and managed by a small team of paid staff under the overall control of the Chief Executive Officer, Mr Craig Backhouse, who makes regular reports to, and is responsible to, the Board of Trustees.

Risk management

The Trustees review the major risks that the organisation faces each year, when preparing and updating their budgets and activities plans. They are developing systems to monitor and control those risks to mitigate any impact they may have on the organisation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 20% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 20% on cost

Computer equipment

- 33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
