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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the Charity are to help and educate school pupils in Wales through participation in athletics so to develop their physical mental and spiritual capacities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.

Significant activities

The Charity fulfils its objects by providing athletic competition from school to national and international level for the young people of Wales. This includes track, field and cross country running throughout Wales.

Public benefit

In shaping their objectives for the year and planning the Charity's activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Schools Association has continued to work in partnership with Welsh Athletics during the 2019/20 academic year. WSAA continues to work to align competition pathways and become a fully integrated part of Welsh Athletics.

Domestically, competition began on Sunday, November 3rd. with the Joint Indoor Combined Events Championships, held at NIAC, Cardiff. This led to selection for 16 young athletes to attend the Indoor International which was again held at the Emirates Arena in Glasgow on November 30th. Congratulations to Dylan Morgan (Ysgol Gyfun Gwyr), winner of the individual bronze medal in the Under 16 Boys Championship. Performance levels again exceeded expectations with 8 athletes breaking the 3000 point barrier and with 33 personal bests set in individual events.

The Inter Schools Cross Country returned to Brecon on Saturday, November 16th. There were 504 finishers on the day across the six race program. This compared to the 366 from 2018, the experiment of combining with the Welsh Athletics Inter Regional competition having a positive effect on numbers. The Welsh Colleges Championships were also an integral part of the competition program. WSAA selected teams of 4 to participate at the Home Countries International held in Stirling in January based on results.

Teams representing the eight School Districts were back at Brecon for the National Cross-Country Championships on Wednesday March 11th. Levels of participation were again encouraging with 555 athletes stepping up to the start line across the 8 races. Following this event teams were selected to travel to Falkirk in Scotland for the SIAB Cross Country (40 athletes). Sadly, at this point, the Association was overtaken by events as the COVID 19 situation escalated which meant that this competitive opportunity was lost. March also saw the Welsh Schools Sportshall Final at Cwmbran which was again an unqualified success, just ahead of the restrictions being imposed.

The Schools summer Track & Field Championships were another casualty of the crisis, closely followed by the NASUWT Cup & Plate and the SIAB Track & Field. The Association now awaits the opportunity to restart its' competition programmes as well as continuing to support School District competition across Wales.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The Charity has achieved a net expenditure of £6,034 (2019: £2,037) for the current year. The Charity retains a healthy level of reserves of £48,367 (2019: £54,401).

Reserves policy

The reserves held at 31st March 2020, all of which are unrestricted, are considered to be sufficient to meet the charity's financial liabilities for the foreseeable future and appropriate steps have been taken to improve future reserve levels.

Welsh Schools Athletics Association continues to foster strong operational and strategic links with Welsh Athletics (National Governing Body for Athletics). It is intended that going forward the operational delivery of the WSAA programmes be integrated within the Welsh Athletics delivery objectives - with funding of core activities being provided by Welsh Athletics. The WSAA are in the process of updating its governance and operational structures to align with the Welsh Athletics operational objectives. Discussion remain ongoing relating to the preferred model of delivery - at the signing date, no final decision has been made, but all parties remain confident of maintaining and enhancing the partnership.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Charity is controlled by its Constitution adopted in 1948, as amended in July 1966 and November 1980 and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Board shall consist of the elected Executive Officers of the WSAA, the 2 appointed representatives from each of the 8 School Districts (in addition to the Executive Officers) and the Welsh Athletics representative.

All nominations for elected Executive members must be made by a School District or an Officer of a School District. The nomination must be submitted (together with the nominee's written consent). The nomination must be received by the Secretary at least 4 weeks before the date of the Annual General Meeting in which the election is to take place. The Secretary will confirm receipt of valid nominations in writing to the nominator as soon as reasonably practicable after such receipt.

Nomination details shall be forwarded to all Members at least 7 days prior to the Annual General Meeting and individuals are appointed at the AGM.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going concern

As disclosed in the Report of the Trustees, Welsh Schools Athletics Association continues to foster strong operational and strategic links with Welsh Athletics (National Governing Body for Athletics). It is intended that going forwards, the operational delivery of the WSAA programmes be integrated within the Welsh Athletics delivery objectives - with funding of core activities being provided by Welsh Athletics. The WSAA are in the process of updating its governance and operational structures to align with the Welsh Athletics operational objectives. Discussion remains ongoing relating to the preferred model of delivery - at the signing date, no final decision has been made, but all parties remain confident of maintaining and enhancing the partnership. Consequently WSAA will operate with minimal income and expenditure. It will continue to operate though and will be able to meet all its liabilities as they fall due. The Trustees are satisfied that the charity is a going concern.

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable by the Charity.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. As the Charity has only one category of expenditure, resources expended and support costs are directly attributed to that particular heading.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted Charity. The Charity currently has no restricted funds.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.
