Covid has had an impact on the regular services offered. The Lunch Club stopped operating in November 2019 and other services have been accessed using remote methods where possible.

Working with other Organisations has increased during this period and benefitted our client group.

Referrals from health care professionals and social teams has increased and we have made continuous efforts to improve this joint working.

We celebrated our 25th anniversary prior to the 'lock down' guidance was introduced.

We are still working on the PQASSO now changed to the Charity Mark.

Client feedback 100% positive. Monitoring carried out by independent person and using Survey Monkey.

Beneficiaries gave us an overall 5 star rating for our general support.

The Charity has a policy of holding 3-6 months running costs in reserves. This is based upon the expenditure for the year to 31st March 2020, the Trustees consider £54,000 to be held to 'future proof' the charity against a fall in donations and revenue to allow it to continue for this period and a further £18,000 to be required to cover redundancy costs of staff in the event of the charity ceasing to operate. This leaves a balance of £21,000 considered as free reserves.
