Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	Our main fundraising event of the year was our Christmas Fair which was a great success and raised £4,566. Rob's music festival is now also an annual event in the Beaumont calendar. This music and sports event was open to the local community as well as families and friends of the school and raised just over £9,000, of which £1,500 was presented as a donation to the Prince's Trust. The event is organised by a team comprising sixth form pupils at the school, staff, the BSA and former pupils of the school. As well as raising money for the school and the Prince's trust, this also gives students a valuable experience in event organisation. The family BBQ was repeated in September. It is a relaxing social event for new year 7 pupils and their families and raised £1,604. This was followed in October by the ever popular quiz night, which raised an incredible £2,721. Two other social events also raised funds for the school: A comedy night, hosted by paid comedians, raised £1,627 and a Beaumont staff and parents' Xmas party also raised a similar profit. In addition we have received gift aid and other donations totalling £3,500. Funds paid to the school this year. We have funded items for the school totalling £29,660. Our main donation was to fund a much needed school minibus, to which we could contribute £13,500. We made a second annual donation of £7,500 towards equipping the new science block with fume cupboards. We purchased requests from drama, food technology, music, MFL, PE, D&T, Art textiles, and the SEN, Business & Economics departments received netbooks. The Maths, Geography and Sociology departments now have a professional wall art outside their classrooms area. Art & textiles now have display boards and we used our hardship
		fund of £500 for 2 students' requests.
