We have been working closely with Love Your Neighbour initiative, as well as Gas Street Church and St Luke's Colmore St Church in the delivery of food and baby essentials to those affected by the pandemic.

We joined with the Yardley Early Help Network who funded us to deliver food, formula and nappies specifically to clients in the Yardley area.

We have worked closely with other local charities such as Karis Neighbourhood Scheme Baby Bank, Narthex Food Bank, Anawim, Acacia, B'ham and Solihull Women's Aid, and local HomeStart bases.

We are members of BUMP (Birmingham and Solihull United Maternity and Newborn Partnership).

We continue to work jointly with B'ham Health Visitors and B'ham, Solihull and Sandwell Midwifery Teams and Birmingham Children's Trust.

We received funding from The National Lottery and HM Government Covid Fund and the Emergency Response Heart of England Fund.

We have updated our Lone Worker, Risk Management, Data Protection, Safeguarding, Conflicting Interests, Volunteer Management, Complaints Handling and Paying Staff Policies.

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

To relieve the needs of women in particular, but not exclusively, vulnerable and/or isolated women by the provision of physical, emotional and practical support during pregnancy, childbirth and the postnatal period.

The definition of "vulnerable" women includes women affected by perinatal mental health illnesses, substance absue, domestic abuse victims, refugees, migrants and asylum seekers, victims of human trafficking, human slavery and sexual exploitation or any other vulnerability.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

- Providing advocacy during hospital appointments and Professionals Meetings with Social Services
- Obtaining essential clothes and equipment for mum and baby inc. maternity bras, nappies, cots, formula milk
- One to One pregnancy support and guidance
- Being "on 24/7hr call" for our clients when they reach 38
  weeks pregnant to accompany them to the hospital for the
  birth of their baby
- Providing qualified Doulas to support women during childbirth
- Providing
- Providing qualified Doulas to support at the client's place of residence in the postnatal period, otherwise known as the fourth trimester
- Signposting to other local organisations who can take over support when our time is completed
- Ensuring new mums are well connected into their local communities by accompanying them to their local Stay & Play groups

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and that the purpose and aims of Elayos are for the greater good. All of our charitable activities focus on improving the experience of pregnancy, birth and motherhood for vulnerable and isolated women in the Birmingham community so that they are better able to care for themselves and their babies both during pregnancy and after the birth.

We believe that Elayos' work contributes to women who have previously had their autonomy removed now having informed pregnancies and being actively involved in the decisions surrounding the birth of their children. Studies have shown that support by Doulas during childbirth is associated with a significant reduction in caesarean births as well as a contributing to a trend of shorter labours and less use of epidurals.

With our support we have seen many women come to realise the many benefits of (the economical factor playing a huge part) breastfeeding when they had previously decided to bottle-feed and then have gone on to feed their babies for several months.

As a whole our clients have been able to build stronger bonds with their babies and learned better parenting skills.
