The end of this period of course was plagued by the COVID-19 Pandemic and as such to safeguard our community MY Foundation shut down all its in person activities however we found our online community growing at an exponential rate. Several events carried out within the period include: 1. MYF Celebratory & Commemorative Lectures- the MYF team grew to over 30 core volunteer members who over the course of the period detailed above ran over 12 themed events spanning over 30 days throughout the year. The events have a core knowledge component delivered via lectures from esteemed scholars and allow for the spiritual and religious guidance of the community. MYF is now catering to thousands of community members across

The lectures were moved to an online platform making use of Zoom and Youtube live facilities in order to safeguard the community and we saw a huge increase in viewership across all online platforms 2. MYF Sports- the MYF team ran weekly sports activities for the youth including football for both boys and girls up to the age of 16. 3. Careers Clinic/CV Workshops- The MY Foundation team ran a CV/ Careers clinic for A Level/ College Students to get a better understanding of the different types of career paths available to them across the fields of Science, Media, Law, Medicine/Healthcare, Finance and Social Sciences. 4. Mental Health Awareness- the MYF Aspire unit led a series of workshops focusing on mental wellbeing and focusing on bettering our communities' mental health through the use of psychiatrist led sessions and spiritual experts.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	The Charity showed income totalling £51,565 for the year ended 31 March 2020. A decrease of £2,945 on income in the year ended 31 March 2019. The decrease in income is primarily due to a fall in the level of governmental grants received as the Charity halted all its programmes due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. Expenditure totalled £30,991 for the year ended 31 March 2020, an increase of £5,442 compared to the previous year ended 31 March 2019. This is due to an increase in educational activities and events that were held up until the UK went in to lockdown. Funding will continue to be a challenge for the Charity. In order to mitigate this risk the Trustees' are working hard to secure more monthly standing orders as well as reach out to the key donors.

Due to the Charity's strict expenditure policy, Trustees' endeavour to keep the costs as low as possible leading to a small surplus amount saved each month. This ensures that the charity has sufficient unrestricted reserves to support the day-to-day operational activities of the organisation.
