Hedgehog Haven provides a service to the general public and Veterinary Surgeries where sick, injured and orphaned hedgehogs can be taken to.

The charity's objectives [the Objects] are:

- a) For the benefit of the general public to relieve the suffering of wild animals, in particular hedgehogs, in need of care and attention and, in particular, to provide and maintain rescue homes or other facilities for the reception, care and treatment of such animals with a view to repatriating them to their natural and appropriate habitat, wherever possible.

- b) With special reference to hedgehogs, to promote humane behaviour towards all animals, by providing appropriate care, protection, treatment and security for animals, which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage and to educate the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering among animals.
- To try to stop the selling of Glue Traps as we have had a number of cases of hedgehogs caught on them and have had to be put to sleep.
- d) To make the public more aware of the dangers of using strimmers.

Additional details of objectives and activities (Optional information)

We are continuing to try to educate young and old alike by giving them a contact point for any member of the public finding sick/injured/orphaned hedgehogs in an effort to protect an endangered species from becoming extinct. Difficult this year owing to Lockdown.

We are also trying to encourage everyone to put food and water out for hedgehogs and to stop using pesticides, rat poison and slug pellets and also to make the public aware of the injuries strimmers cause.

Now we are trying to make public aware of leaving holes in the ground where they are either going to put fence posts or shrubs.

Also we have been in touch with the BHPS regarding Glue Traps.

We are now trying to make dog owners more aware/responsible when letting their dogs out into their garden late at night by using a lead.

We do all the above in various ways, i.e. our website, advice leaflets and when we give talks to various organisations and schools.

We are continuing to try to encourage members of the public to provide access to and from their gardens to allow hedgehogs wider opportunity for habitat etc.

A great contribution is made by member volunteers. We are grateful for the many hours volunteers have spent caring for hedgehogs, collection of sick and injured hedgehogs and re-homing them. Also their help in fund raising for us.

Also for the new volunteers who make items for us to sell to raise funds.
Including our volunteer who runs our e-bay account selling items to raise funds.

Once again we also wish to acknowledge our Independent Examiner, who carries out the necessary checks of our yearly accounts.

Without our volunteers, and Independent Examiners help, advice and time we could not continue without all their sterling efforts.

Anne Taylor at Wickham Bishops is now the main stay for the surrounding areas. Although her contact details are not available to the public. The public make contact with Christine at Frinton, who either directs them to Spring Lodge Vets in Witham if they cannot get the hogs to Frinton, or Christine contacts Anne on the best way forward.

Anne has been a stoic presence to Hedgehog Haven since the closure of Colchester. Sheila at Chelmsford could no longer cope with actual caring for hogs, but she is now taken up the banner of educating the public at events and talks. Also Stephanie in Colchester who carries out talks at various venues for us.

we enrolled a number of volunteers to take hogs once treated and fully recovered to get them up to safe weight for releasing and this has helped.

We are now looking for more volunteers to help with hoglets and hand feeding.

We have Julie Moore who is wanting to set up an Ipswich Centre. Shed, electrics all installed, she will be under Hedgehog Haven for her first year, it will be reviewed in about a years' time, as to whether she remains under Hedgehog Haven or if she will run her own Rescue Centre.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Since opening in May 2007, over 5,000 hedgehogs have passed through our centres either by the general public contacting us directly, through local veterinary surgeries and also referrals from St Tiggywinkles, the BHPS and the RSPCA.

Since opening we have never turned away a hedgehog that needs care. We are also continuing to take in hedgehogs from the areas surrounding Tiptree and Colchester since the rescue centres there closed down and also from the rescue centre in Thorrington when they are closed.

We hold cash of £3,000 + in our Treasurers Savings Account and £40,000 + in our Treasurers Bank Account. We have a Savings account with £40,000+. We aim to ensure we have enough funds in our bank account to cover veterinary fees, medication, which is one of our biggest expenditures after purchasing food stuffs.

The savings account is for any building projects that may be needed. We aim to hold at least £5,000 and no more than £80,000 in reserve at the year end.

We are conscious that our time is becoming more precious so are more reliant on keeping our funds topped up incase we are unable to go out and fund raise ourselves.

Through raising these funds we have been able to purchase/make more cages etc. upgrade soft release pens. Paying for the day-to-day running expenses, i.e. veterinary bills, medications, food stuffs, cleaning materials, insurance, licence fees.

Future Plans

We aim to continue our record of 'Never turning away a hedgehog that needs our care and attention'. During 2020 we did have to advise Spring Lodge that Wickham Bishops was full for a few weeks during the Autumn.

To continue raising public awareness of the dangers to all wild animals especially to Hedgehogs, which are now on the UK red list of species vulnerable to extinction.

To enrol more volunteers to look after hedgehogs once they have made a full recovery and they just need to attain a safe weight of 600g in the summer and 650g in Autumn before releasing.

Also to train volunteers to take hoglets once they have been stabilised to continue the hand feeding until they are able to feed themselves. Unable to do this during 2020 due to Lockdown.

Liz at Colchester has not taken in any hogs for the past 2+ years. Anne Taylor at Wickham Bishops is now running a Rescue Centre for Hedgehog Haven and she has done a sterling job. Christine could not have coped or continued without her sterling efforts.

Líz will be giving us her decision at the AGM regarding re-opening Colchester. She obviously could not do any fund raising due to COVID19. So it is dependent on whether she opens Colchester again as to whether she will continue to be a Trustee for Hedgehog Haven and Committee member. We will obviously be sorry to see her go if she decides not to re-open.

Look at finding someone in the Colchester area that could take on the role of Rescuer in that area and setting them up.

Obviously the Pandemic has caused both Christine at Frinton and Anne at Wickham Bishops extreme difficulties.

We will be considering the purchase of a new shed for the Wickham Bishops Branch.

Also getting Julie at Ipswich up and running in 2021.
