Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2020 Report of the Trustees



The trustees are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements for the year ending 31 March 2020.

Our purposes and activities

Our purpose is to further such charitable purposes (charitable under English law) as the trustees see fit from time to time by the provision of grants in Colchester and the surrounding areas. Our activities are predominantly the organisation and running of amateur sporting events, principally the Colchester Half Marathon, and other general fundraising activities. The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charities Commission's general guidance on public benefit when planning future activities and making grants.

During the year the charity prepared to hold the 2020 Colchester Half Marathon. On 16 March 2020, due to UK Government advice related to the global coronavirus pandemic, the Trustees took the difficult decision to cancel the 2020 race which was due to be held on 29 March 2020. A significant amount of expenditure had already been incurred in preparing the race. All entrants have been granted discounted entry to the next event, and offered the option to receive their race medals and t-shirts. The Trustees are pleased that the reaction from the running community has been largely positive, accepting that the restrictions imposed on large scale events were designed to protect the public in uncertain times.

The accounts for the year to 31 March 2020 reflect the costs incurred in preparation for the 2020 event and the income received from entries. Provisions totalling £12k have been made to fulfil the obligations to suppliers and a further £29k for discounted entry to the next event. The Trustees agreed to make donations to the charities that had helped prepared for the 2020 event, albeit at lower amounts than previous years. Retained funds will be carried forward to the 2020/21 financial year. It is hoped that the charity partners engaged in the 2020 preparations will continue for the next event so that we are able to donate the surplus between them.

The charity maintains strong links to Colchester Colne Round Table, and all current trustees are current or former members of that organisation.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Colchester Half Marathon
