TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT 2020

Objectives and activities

The Methodist Church is regulated by the Methodist Church Act of 1976.

- Provision of public worship open to all
- The teaching and promotion of Christianity as a way of life through worship and other events
- Provision of pastoral care to those who require it
- Evangelism appropriate to the context
- Mission to the local community by provision of a safe space
- Good stewardship of resources

In the past year we have been challenged by the limitations imposed by the consequences of the Covid 19 pandemic. Lockdowns and restrictions on gatherings have had a negative impact on our objectives and activities. However, some positives have emerged as we have sought to continue our mission through other means. Since April 2020 we have had a weekly online service which has been made available via the Zoom platform; viewing figures indicate an increase in those engaging with worship. Moreover, we began a weekly *In Touch* publication as a means of communicating with the church community; this has been available electronically and hard copies have been sent to those without the means to access it online.

Achievements of the year

Whilst it was necessary to furlough several members of staff, our commitment to being a positive and welcoming presence in the centre of Bolton is undiminished. Lockdown and other restrictions have had a negative impact on numbers using the building and de facto, on our finances. However, we have made strenuous efforts to market ourselves as a meeting venue as we have the space to allow people to meet whilst observing social distancing regulations; this has resulted in some new lettings which we trust will stay beyond the current crisis.

The facilities team have shifted their efforts from the usual pre-Lockdown day to day to tackling jobs around the building which are more difficult when people are present. A burst water pipe led to an insurance claim which led to parquet flooring being renewed and resurfaced, in addition to redecoration work. Thanks to a donation from a church member, the Walker Suite has been refurbished and new audio equipment installed. These are just some examples of how we have not simply "stood still" but have continued our programme of renewals and repairs so that we have a suite of premises which is better suited to serve the community and the needs of the church.

In short, our main achievements have been our online worship, increased pastoral contacts and improvements to the building.

Financial Review

The Mission is supported by the Bolton and Rochdale District (of which it is a part) through the provision of a Superintendent minister part-time – a role fulfilled by the Chair of the District. We pay an annual contribution towards the salary cost and, also, an assessment fee towards the District expenses.

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We have only made a small surplus this year of £310. This means we have lost in the region of £45000 this year. This is entirely due to the Covid 19 pandemic. We were in a good position at the beginning of March. However, we had to close totally from the 23rd of March 2020 until the 16th of June 2020. We were able to furlough some of our staff and the grants, although helpful, didn't cover our full costs. We had to completely close the concert hall, which is where a lot of our losses came from. Our congregation supported us by signing up to pay with standing orders or made contributions on our website via Just Giving. We re-negotiated rents during the lockdown period. We agreed to reduce them so that our tenants were able to remain financially viable. Our hall manager has worked heroically to keep our rental income going and has had some success with that, but the latest lockdown brought more cancellations. Our new Business Manager has already made an impact by revamping our Friends offering and more people than ever are signing up to that. We are looking for grant income as a means of moving forward and are awaiting the results of two applications with more planned. The Business Manager has been very active in this process.

We are, therefore, hopeful that we can stabilise our losses by the end of the next financial year. We have incurred some expenses during the lockdown period as we have used that time to complete planned repairs and maintenance and the premises are looking refreshed and ready for use as soon as we are able to open. Next year will be essential maintenance only until we are in a more stable position. There are strong indications of demand for use when we are able to re-open which is encouraging.

Structure, governance and management

Our situation in relation to the Methodist Church is a little unusual. Most churches are part of a wider grouping, a circuit. Bolton Methodist Mission is unusual in that it is a church and Circuit in its own right. With the help of TCC (Transforming Churches and Communities), we are seeking to clarify the roles of and relationship between church and circuit. BMM is also anomalous in that a substantial business venture (through hire of the Main Hall and other rooms) generates income for the church; as a consequence, the church is ultimately responsible for running the business. As part of our development plan we are looking at setting up a more formal, and we believe, more effective structure to the mutual benefit of church and business.

Running concurrently with our internal considerations, the Methodist Church has challenged all churches to look at their relationships with other churches in the circuit in which they sit; this could result in some churches handing over trusteeship to the circuit meeting. Similarly, the seven Districts in the North West and Mann region of the Methodist Church are considering a way of restructuring. It is imperative that our internal governance is in good shape for that time when we may be asked to become part of a different external structure

We have recently appointed a new Safeguarding Officer. She is pro-actively looking at our procedures and ensuring that individuals have necessary DBS clearance and have undergone necessary training. Outside organisations using our building must also have a safeguarding policy and are required to comply with those of the Methodist Church.

Reference and administrative details

The Charity is known as the Bolton Methodist Mission, Charity Number 1130745 and the address is Knowsley Street, Bolton BL1 2AS. The premises encompass the Victoria Hall – a Grade Two listed 1300-seater concert venue- used frequently for events, the Victoria Buildings which are in front of the building in Knowsley Street and some of which is rented out, and the Walker Memorial building which backs on to Central Street car park. This is similarly home to a number of different groups.
