## Trustees' annual report For the year ended 30 June 2020

The Directors, who are also Trustees of the charity, submit their annual report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2020.

The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statements of Recommended Practice (SORP), applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015) (2<sup>nd</sup> edition).

#### **Objectives**

The objectives of the charity are the promotion of humane behaviour towards animals, in particular but not exclusively by undertaking research into all aspects of animal welfare and publishing the useful results of that research, and by educating the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering among animals.

In shaping our objectives for the year and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

#### Governance

Implementing a recommendation from the Independent Examiner, a third trustee was pointed on 27<sup>th</sup> October 2020, Professor Robert Garner. Professor Garner was appointed following a consideration of candidates' expertise and experience in the field of the CASJ's work and activities, whereby, given Professor Garner's leading position in the academic field of animal protection politics and policy, his extensive experience in administering and carrying out related research projects and experience in supervising PhD candidates, was considered the outstanding candidate.

#### Achievements and performance

The following activities summarise our main work towards meeting this objective during this year:

- We have contributed to an animal welfare ethics and policy module in a Masters programme at the University of Edinburgh.
- Provided expert advice to a publisher regarding the publication of a new book on animal-human relations
- We received the Shining World Compassion Award in recognition of our 'pioneering approach to protecting animals'.
- We have continued to monitor developments in animal welfare governance in the UK, including the work of the Scottish Animal Welfare Commissioner and the replacement for the advisory Farm Animal Welfare Committee, the Animal Welfare Committee.
- We have provided advice and input into a project exploring mechanisms to allow the perspective or voice of nonhuman animals to be represented in policy processes that affects their wellbeing.
- Research we have funded has been published in the academic journal British Politics.
- We have liaised with animal welfare policy makers in a major political party to promote our key idea of a government institution dedicated to representing animals' interests.
- We have continued to explore the options for funding PhD research students in our field.

- We have co-developed and are now the major funder (after the year end) for a new international comparative animal welfare governance research project.
- We have being conducting literature searches and reviews comprising the early phases of our comparative animal welfare governance project.
- We have contributed towards a campaign to improve legal protections for aquatic animals.
- We have contributed to a project exploring animal ethics and politics through the lens of creative writing.
- Provided lecture and materials for animal ethics and policy component of training course at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland.

Covid-19 has not had a significant impact on our activities.

#### **Future Plans**

Our significant plans for the future include:

- A deliberative democracy exercise (e.g. a 'Citizen's Jury') exploring society's political obligations to non-human animals
- Develop a programme for funding PhD studentships and post-doctoral fellowships in the field of animal welfare public policy.
- Leading a research project on comparative international animal welfare governance and developing subsequent project based on the findings.
- Liaising with animal protection NGOs and public policy actors to promote better representation
   of animal interests in policy-making.

#### **Reserves Policy**

Our reserves policy is to have a minimum of one year's fixed costs in reserve, currently approximately £26,000. At the end of this period, we held approximately £418,000 in reserves due to further legacy income. However, shortly before issuing this report we have initiated funding of our comparative research project, which we intend to act as a pilot study for larger projects in future that we will be in a position to fund. We will be reviewing our reserves policy during 2021.

#### Structure, governance and management

Centre for Animals and Social Justice was incorporated on 23 June 2011 and registered as a charity on 12 October 2011 and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association which were last updated on 17 March 2016. Its legal status is that of a company limited by guarantee (Company No. 07681014) and a registered charity (Charity No. 1144250). It has no share capital and the liability of each member in the event of winding up is limited to £1.

Overall management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustee Directors who are elected and coopted under the terms of the Memorandum and Articles of Association. Day to day project activity is carried out by the CEO.

## Notes to the Accounts For the year ended 30 June 2020

#### 1 Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of preparation

Centre for Animals and Social Justice is a charitable company in the United Kingdom limited by guarantee. In the event that the charity is wound up the liability in respect of the gurantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the company information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (second edition), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and with the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have taken advantage of the exemption to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity as defined under FRS102. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and are rounded to the nearest £1.

#### (b) Income

Income is recognised in the SOFA when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the monies have been met, the receipt of the income is probable and its amount can be reliably measured.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. Legacies are treated as income when they are received, or on a receivable basis for all individual legacies which have been notified prior to the accounting reference date and become capable of financial measurement prior to the sign off of the accounts.

#### (c) Expenditure and liabilities

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred.

#### (d) Tangible fixed assets

All items of capital expenditure below £500 are written off as incurred.

Depreciation has been calculated to write down the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of all tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives on a straight line basis.

#### (e) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

## Notes to the Accounts - continued For the year ended 30 June 2020

#### 1 Accounting Policies - continued

#### (f) Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

#### (g) Trade creditors

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the charity does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date. If there is an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months

Trade creditors are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### (h) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income receivable or generated for the objects of the organisation without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the charity's work or for specific artistic projects being undertaken by the charity.

#### (i) Pensions

The organisation has a defined contributions pension scheme. Contributions are charged in the accounts as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.

#### (j) Operating lease rentals

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### (k) Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.
