Throughout the year the charity has supported many young people within the Harlow area supporting their education. No Child Without supports young people from low income families whose education is being affected by the parent's income. We have supplied young people with clothing such as P.E kits, Jackets and Uniform. For example, without P.E kit students are less likely to get involved in lessons, therefore affecting their education. We have also been able to send students on Geography and History trips to support their GCSE's, if we were not able to support these young people it would affect their GCSE results.

Supply P.E kit/uniform – many parents have been unable to supply uniform and P.E kit which the charity has purchased for them. Without this students would feel and look different and could ultimately lead to being bullied or singled out by peers. Because of the funding given to these young people this has been avoided.

School trips – parents who have been unable to afford trips for GCSE lessons have been subsidised or paid for by the charity. Without this support students would not have been able to completed vital coursework, which would therefore affect their overall grade. Sports

Overseas Trips- the charity has offered support with subsidising students who deserve to experience these trips. Some young people may never have left the country or been on a plane before, therefore we are helping to improve their culture experiences as well as giving them an emotional experience they will never forget.

Music lessons – GCSE and other young people have been given the opportunity to attend extra curriculum lessons and improve their skills and take qualifications.
