Providing grants to Foodbanks for the relief of poverty and other local charities supporting people with health issues. 3. Providing grants to those providing humanitarian aid following natural disasters. 4. Collecting unwanted spectacles and hearing aids for recycling and reuse to provide aids to those that cannot afford them. 5. Supplying Emergency Information bottles to members of the local community with health concerns, aiding their independent living.
