2. STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The PCC has, as a governing document, two pieces of Church of England legislation, called Measures. These are the Parochial Church Councils (Powers) Measure 1956 as amended and the Church Representation Rules 2020 as amended.

The PCC is constituted as an unincorporated association. It is registered as charity with the Charity Commission.

Lay representatives of the Diocesan and Deanery Synods, Licensed Lay Ministers and Churchwardens are ex-officio members of the PCC. Lay members were elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), which was delayed until October 2020 due to the COVID pandemic.

The Revd Nick Alexander (Associate Minister) resigned from the parish on 9 March 2020 to take up the post of Associate Minister at Moulton Parish Church in Northamptonshire.

COMMITTEES

The PCC usually meets quarterly. During 2020, the PCC met three times online and once by correspondence. The Annual Meeting of Parishioners and Annual Parochial Church Meeting were delayed due to the COVID pandemic with the permission of the Registrar and Bishop of the Diocese. The postponed meetings were held in October 2020 in St Mary's Church. As usual, these were combined with a service of rededication.

The PCC Standing Committee consists of the vicar and Associate Minister, parish curate, parish churchwardens, parish treasurer, PCC secretary, St Peter's treasurer and one elected member of the PCC from each church (Mr R Goodchild and Mr J Dixon). The standing committee has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the Council. During 2020, it met more frequently than usual, owing to the rapidly changing situation resulting from the COVID pandemic. In total, it met eight times online and once by email correspondence.

The **Hyndman Centre Management Committee** is chaired by David Crofts and covers all aspects of the use and maintenance of this parish asset.

St Mary's and St Peter's District Church Councils (DCCs). Since April 2017, the two churches have worked together under a Scheme of Delegation. Each has its own District Church Council, which meets at least three times per year, and reports to the PCC. The separate meetings are able to discuss matters affecting the individual churches. All policy, financial and faculty matters and proposals affecting the whole parish are referred to the PCC. Each church has its own subcommittees.

Each church has its own Mission Focus group which considers the support of mission partners and other agencies to deliver the parish's objectives.

The **patron** of the parish is The Hyndman Trustees.

The **parish staff team** (clergy, administrator, pastor, readers and children and families' worker) met three times during 2020, once in St Mary's church and twice online. Their meetings cover matters relating to coordinating events and services, pastoral care and worship. Members of the staff team met weekly for prayer until mid-March 2020, and from the end of March they joined in with Daily Prayer online.

A full health and safety risk assessment was last carried out in 2015. The policy can be found on our website (www.wearechurch.net). The health and safety policy was reviewed in 2017, ensuring that there is a policy for each of the three sites and St Mary's health and safety policy was reviewed again in 2018.

The PCC complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to House of Bishop's guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults).

3. CHARITABLE AIMS AND PURPOSES

Church of England parishes seek to promote the whole mission of the church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

This aim was expressed in a statement in 2017 as follows:

WE SEEK TO WORSHIP THE GOD AND FATHER OF OUR LORD JESUS IN THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT; TO TEACH THE BIBLE IN A WAY RELEVANT TO EVERYDAY LIFE; TO GROW PEOPLE IN FAITH, UNDERSTANDING AND LOVE; TO EQUIP PEOPLE TO SERVE OTHERS; TO

OFFER PEOPLE OPPORTUNITIES TO MEET JESUS AND DISCOVER FORGIVENESS AND NEW LIFE.

PARISH STATISTICS

The Parish of St Mary with St Peter is 2.6 square miles of central and southern Bury St Edmunds, characterised by residential estates and town centre businesses. The parish population in 2018 was 12,760, living in approximately 5700 households. In 2019, the PCC consented to a scheme to enlarge the parish by extending its eastern boundary to take in an area up to Rougham Lane, where many more homes are to be built in the coming years.

The parish is ranked 9161 out of the Church of England's 12,382 parishes according to indices of deprivation (1= most deprived). The age profile of residents is older than the national average.

4. CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

Prior to the restrictions imposed from March 2020 onwards by the government in response to the Covid-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic, the parish fulfilled its aims and purposes including providing the following public charitable services:

- Public worship in two churches, using a variety of styles to reach a wide range of people (contemporary worship, choral Morning Prayer and Holy Communion, Messy Church, Café Church, Book of Common Prayer). This diversity of worship styles is very unusual in a Church of England parish and is a major strength. Public prayer and worship take place every day. During 2020, churches were obliged to close between 23 March and early July, and again for the month of November. Public worship continued in our parish for the remainder of the year. In addition, we held services online from 22 March throughout the remainder of the year. One or two online services took place every Sunday via Zoom and were attended by members of our own congregations as well as people from other churches and even other towns and countries. Daily Prayer took place every day on Facebook and a substantial and committed group of people have engaged with this throughout the year.
- Pastoral care and support. St Mary's is a popular church for weddings, and although
 weddings were not permitted to take place for much of the year, we continued to
 support and engage with marriage couples. Those weddings which did go ahead
 were restricted by law in numbers who were permitted to attend. Funeral ministry
 continued throughout the year, and our ministers were committed to supporting the
 bereaved at this most difficult time.

- Opportunities to explore the Christian faith and to deepen personal discipleship with the encouragement of other Christians. Both churches have strong small groups for Bible study and prayer. Most of these continued online throughout the year when they were no longer able to meet in person.
- St Marys' Church is open seven days a week in normal circumstances and receives a
 large number of visitors. The historic Grade 1 listed building is a major attraction but
 in 2020 we were unable to open for tourism after March. With the help of our team
 of volunteer stewards, we were able to open the church for private prayer through
 much of the year, apart from the two periods of lockdown when churches were
 obliged to close.
- St Mary's Church is the civic church of Bury St Edmunds and welcomes a large number of people to services of widespread local importance. We see this as a vital way of positively relating to many people who do not regularly worship and to promote the welfare of Bury St Edmunds. The vicar works with many local organisations to support their work and to witness to the concern of God for the wider world. During 2020, we have had to be creative in finding ways of continuing this important work in a world where we are unable to meet with each other.
- St Peter's Church has developed a creative relationship with Westgate School. This is
 increasingly recognised beyond the town as a leading example of community
 engagement. The Children's and Families' Worker, Associate Minister and volunteers
 offer hospitality and provide focussed support to families and children in particular
 need, within a carefully agreed framework. Efforts were made through 2020 to
 obtain additional funding to support the role of Children's and Family Worker.
- The PCC owns the Hyndman Centre, a former school, next to St Peter's Church in Hospital Road. The Hyndman Centre is a major community resource for Bury St Edmunds and its extensive facilities are in use throughout the week. In normal circumstances, a very large number of people use the centre for a wide range of activities which promote wellbeing, health, social support and the work of the church. During 2020, the pandemic forced the closure of the centre from late March to the end of August. We were able to re-open from September, and the Centre stayed open throughout the second lockdown for a limited number of permitted activities, such as approved training courses and support groups. Following information disclosed by the Hyndman Trustees about the origin of their charity, which was established with funds derived from the trade in enslaved people, the PCC established a working group to consider whether it is appropriate to continue to memorialise the Hyndman name in the naming of the centre.
- Bury St Edmunds has well-established ecumenical networks and the parish fully participates in these. Ecumenical initiatives such as Bury Drop In, Bury Town Pastors,

- Sporting '87 and Bury Christian Youth are supported by the parish and its regular worshippers.
- The PCC supports a large number of mission and charity partners, through the two churches. This extends our work to fulfil our aims in the wider world.

The vicar, the associate minister and the PCC have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion.

The Parochial Church Council works diligently to ensure it fulfils its responsibilities for safeguarding, employment, financial management, upkeep and repair of its buildings and stewardship of its resources.

5. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The Covid-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic had a large impact on the activities of the parish. At all times we sought to comply with the regulations and restrictions imposed on us, while maintaining our work as far as possible.

Worship ministries

In the period 1 January to 15 March 2020, there were five services in the parish every Sunday. St Mary's held an early morning service of Holy Communion (Book of Common Prayer), a contemporary service, traditional Morning Prayer with robed choir, Choral Evensong/ Evening Prayer. St Peter's held a service of Morning Prayer or Holy Communion. There was also a weekly midweek Holy Communion service at St Mary's, and regular services in Cornwallis Court, Cullum Road and Glastonbury Court. In addition, St Peter's Church held a 'Messy Church' service on the third Sunday afternoon of the month in the Hyndman Centre. Each month, we held a Parish Prayer meeting. A St Peter's Vision Prayer Meeting was held weekly. Daily Prayer was said every morning in St Mary's Church.

From 22 March and through the remainder of 2020, the pattern of worship changed significantly in compliance with the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions. A parish online service was held on every Sunday. St Peter's Church held a second online service during the second lockdown in the month of November. Daily Prayer was livestreamed seven days a week on Facebook throughout the year from late March.

We re-opened both of our churches for face-to-face services from 5 July and services were held in both churches every Sunday through the remainder of the year, apart from the

month of November when they were suspended by the government for a second time. At least one service of Holy Communion was held in the parish every Sunday. Although no congregational singing was permitted, music was a feature of most services as our musicians took turns on a rota basis to play and sing as permitted.

Many of our regular civic services were not able to go ahead. However, we were able to hold the Remembrance Day service online. The Jankyn Smyth Commemoration service was streamed online.

The VJ Day Commemoration Service and the Battle of Britain Commemoration Service both took place in St Mary's Church, with heavy restrictions on numbers attending.

Some other special services which were able to go ahead in St Mary's, including the harvest services, the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and service of rededication, a Messy Advent service, St Mary's Carols Service (which was also livestreamed), Midnight Holy Communion and two Christmas Day services. St Peter's, held a licensing service for Andy Williams, a harvest service, and a Family Communion Service on Christmas morning. Other services, such as the Good Friday service of Meditations, the Light up a Life Service, St Peter's carol service and a parish crib service, were held online.

Records were kept of church attendances, which varied substantially through the year. At the peak in the autumn, St Mary's had total attendances at in-church services of around 110 and St Peter's around 60. It is too early to say what the long-term impact of the pandemic will be on the size of our congregations.

Services for life events (baptisms, weddings and funerals) were held in both churches.

At St Mary's Church, the numbers (with 2019 figures in brackets) were: 1 (2) thanksgiving services for the birth of a child, 3 (6) baptisms, 4 (4) weddings, 0 (1) wedding blessing, 6 (10) funerals, 0 (0) renewal of marriage vows and 0 (0) memorial services.

At St Peter's Church there were 0 (4) baptisms, 0 (1) thanksgiving services for a child, 0 (0) weddings, 0 (0) wedding blessings, 0 (0) renewal of marriage vows, 4 (3) funerals and 1 (0) memorial services.

The parish conducted 25 (16) funerals at a crematorium or cemetery in 2020, making a total of 35 (29) funeral services conducted by members of staff as well as 2 (1) interments of ashes.

St Mary's Church was closed to visits for the purpose of tourism for most of the year. The church was kept open for a period for private prayer each day.

The annual Parish Holiday Club took place online. Pre-recorded videos were broadcast for the benefit of families throughout the year.

Electoral Roll and Membership

In 2020, we carried out revisions of the Electoral Roll in April and again in October. At the October APCM there were 272 (272) on the electoral roll. Of these, 193 (194) were on St Mary's electoral roll, and 81 (80) were on St Peter's roll. Two names appeared on both rolls.

Raising voluntary income through giving

Both St Mary's and St Peter's made strong efforts in campaigns during 2019 to raise income from planned giving, as a response to the generosity of God. We are thankful to the members of both churches who responded with pledges to raise giving substantially. It has been encouraging to find that voluntary giving has not suffered as much as might have been predicted during the pandemic.

At St Mary's in 2020 £129,332 (2019: £120,647) was given to the general fund through collections, tax effective regular giving and general donations. £15,218 (2019 £17,137) was given by or through the church for other charities or good causes.

At St Peter's in 2020 £74,245 (2019: £77,758) was given to the general fund through collections, tax effective regular giving and general donations. £13,176 (2019 £9,259) was given by or through the church for other charities or good causes.

Parish share

The parish contribution to the diocesan share was £166,744 (2019 £157,600). In 2021 the parish will pay a contribution of £154,000.

Other activities

St Mary's shares the site of the ancient and ruined Abbey of St Edmund with the cathedral, the public Abbey Gardens and others. Plans to celebrate the millennium of the Abbey's foundation in 1020 were postponed.

Whilst we would usually do many things as separate churches, in 2020 we operated as a parish for many of our activities, and we came together for our online services and Daily Prayer.

This year's holiday club was entitled Adventurers and was made available online.

Most of our social activities were suspended for the greater part of 2020. Bible Study groups continued online. The Men's Group continued with their monthly breakfasts when possible and met online when it was not possible to meet in person. Socially distanced parish walks took place each month from July to October. Social evenings under the banner of 'Reaching Out' were organised online on a regular basis. The monthly 'Crafts Around the World' evening continued online with a specific aim of reaching those who do not usually attend church.

We seek to encourage people to work both with other churches in the town, and the work of the Christian church in the wider community. People from the congregations work with BCY (Bury Christian Youth), the Bury Drop in, Town Pastors, Sporting 87 (a Christian football club), CAP (Christians against poverty) and the St John's Ecumenical Centre.

Operating buildings

The parish maintains St Mary's Church, St Peter's Church and the Hyndman Centre.

Repairs to stone slabs in St Mary's Church and the spire at St Peter's Church were carried out. As usual, regular maintenance and services were carried out in all the buildings. During 2020, the parish carried out some essential repairs and redecoration of the Hyndman Centre during the period of closure.

6. STAFFING AND EMPLOYMENT

During 2020 the parish employed an administrator, administrative assistant, caretaker and events co-ordinator (St Mary's), children and families worker (St Peter's), and two cleaners. Some staff were placed on furlough at times under the government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme. The salaries of each were paid to the employees in full.

The Revd Nick Alexander resigned as Associate Vicar with responsibility for St Peter's Church, to take up an appointment in the Parish of Moulton, Northamptonshire. A special service was held to say farewell to Nick and his wife Julia 8 March 2020. The PCC recorded

its grateful thanks to Nick and Julia for their valuable contribution to the parish during the four and a half years that they were with us.

We were delighted to welcome The Revd Laura Pope to the parish as assistant curate. Prior to ordination as deacon on 5 September she was licensed to the parish as a lay worker.

Andy Williams joined the parish as Associate Minister with responsibility for St Peter's on 1 September, and it was a huge blessing to be able to welcome him with a licensing service in St Peter's attended by invited representatives from the parish and community. He was ordained priest on 6 September.

The parish churchwarden at St Peter's, Phil Hymers, indicated that he would not seek reelection at the annual meeting in 2020. We are grateful for his work during his term of office, and we welcomed Stuart Lowe to this role in October 2020.

DB Di Blasio stood down from his role as Acting Director of Music during 2020, but he has continued as organist at St Mary's. During the latter part of the year, we conducted initial interviews for the position of Director of Music. Chris Ballam has continued as acting Choir Director.

A very large proportion of the activity in the parish is undertaken by volunteers and we are very grateful for their work. During 2020, a number of our ministers as well as lay volunteers found themselves classified as particularly vulnerable to COVID 19 and were therefore unable to continue with their usual range of duties.

7. FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Across the whole Parish income of all funds for 2020 amounted to £293,764 (2019 £371,799) as shown on the financial statements. That included income from bequests and donations in memoriam totaling nil (2019 £45,629). Since no bequests were received a split between unrestricted and restricted bequests is not needed for 2020. £22,824 (2019 £46,652) came from letting the parish hall, which was supplemented by government grants of £10,350 related to the Covid-19 pandemic, £23,380 (2019 £23,590) from investment income, £3,422 (2019 £14,900) from such main charitable activities as weddings and funeral

services and the balance of approximately £233,800 (2019 £241,000) came primarily from church members. There were slightly fewer exceptional items in 2020 within the £233,800 than in 2019. St Peter's Social and Fellowship Fund raised £564 (2019 £2,968). St Peter's activities at Westgate generated £6,282 (2019 £7,443). Stripping out these exceptional items, the recurrent income raised from the congregations amounts to about £226,900 (2019 £230,600).

Again, taking the Parish as a whole, expenditure on charitable activities totaled about £350,500 (2019 £419,900). Various items of exceptional expenditure were incurred in 2020. £22,500 (2019 £23,700) was spent on Fabric at St Mary's. No amount (2019 £10,000) was spent on upgrading the sound system at St Mary's. £16,700 (2019 £16,800) was spent at St Peter's to improve the sound system, to improve disabled access and in preparation for a planned extension to the church building. £1,900 (2019 £2,100) was spent on fabric maintenance at St Peter's. St Mary's Choir Association spent nil (2019 nil) on choir activities. £650 (2019 £2,750) was spent on Social & Fellowship through the St Peter's accounts. £22,800 (2019 £35,000) was charged to St Peter's Daphne Swatman Mission Fund. Expenditure through the General Funds decreased significantly by £16,200 at St Mary's largely associated with the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and decreased by £900 at St Peter's. £38,000 (2019 £63,900) was spent at the Hyndman Centre, the decrease being attributable to a decrease in building and refurbishment works. Expenditure on charitable activities included donations and grants to other charities totaling about £28,400 (2019 £26,400). In addition to expenditure on main charitable activities, costs of fundraising were about £40 (2019 £500).

After taking into consideration a rise in the value of our investments by about £58,900 (2019 £127,600) our income and gains therefore exceeded our expenditure and losses by about £2,100 (2019 £79,000), of which about £nil was attributable to bequests and donations in memoriam (2019 £45,600) and £4,800 attributable to the deficit (2019 £17,200) generated by the Hyndman Centre.

Each of the three component parts of the PCC's financial activities has a reserves policy appropriate to its circumstances.

At the end of 2020 St Mary's had total net assets, excluding permanent endowments, of approximately £958,900. That is made up of £276,200 balances on unrestricted funds and £682,700 balances on restricted funds. Within unrestricted funds, the main balances for day-to-day purposes are the general fund and a linked fund together having a balance of £45,500. This balance is not consistent with the reserves policy of holding sufficient in such reserves to pay six months recurrent bills, but general reserves can have recourse to the Mission Development Fund. The Mission Development Fund is the other main unrestricted

fund with a balance of about £223,500, which the PCC aims to use for development rather than simply maintenance of the mission life of the church, but can, if needed, be used to support the general fund. The main reserves within restricted funds are the Fabric Fund and linked funds, which have total balances of £624,500. The PCC wishes to retain £195,800 consisting of the Rae portfolio intact, leaving £428,700 available to meet any urgent work on the fabric of St Mary's. The £428,700 includes equity-based investments of £335,800, which are subject to stock market fluctuations.

St Peter's has net assets of about £406,000. The main components of these are a Fabric Fund balance of £347,600 (including the surplus on linked investments), other restricted fund balances of £7,600, the balance of the Daphne Swatman Mission Fund of £27,600 and a General Fund balance of £23,200, sufficient to meet normal recurrent bills over a period slightly less than four months.

The Hyndman Centre has net assets of £633,700. That includes the building itself at a valuation of £250,000 plus expenditure incurred to the end of 2013 of £323,600 on planning and building the extension of the hall. General realisable reserves of about £60,100 are held. These are sufficient to meet short-term likely refurbishment costs and to meet recurrent bills for six months.

Amounts not expected to be used in a period of about five years since acquisition are held in equity based pooled investments with the Church of England Investment Fund. Across the Parish these assets, excluding endowment funds, total about £796,800. These rose in value in 2020 by 6.9%. This investment fund has an ethical approach consistent with Church of England ethical principles. A further amount of £634,600 is held with various banks, of which £80,000 is held on deposit with the Church of England Deposit Fund. Much of the amounts held with Church of England Deposit Fund is likely to be spent on further building work being planned at St Mary's church. Bank deposit balances are held at a high level by St Peter's in anticipation of work to be carried out on the Fabric of St Peter's.

8. PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The Covid-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic peaked in January 2021 and still forms the most significant challenge for the parish. The context for our work has changed, as the whole world has battled with the disease. And our ability to work has been severely curtailed by the restrictions imposed upon every UK citizen and organisation for the protection of public health.

The priority for the future begins with continuing the focus that we held in 2020, to continue as far as we are able to deliver the ministry and mission of the Church. We have

learned to be humble with our planning and to be realistic about the uncertainties that cannot be controlled. Plans have been laid and then postponed or changed.

The future plans can be summarised as follows:

- To work to the greatest extent possible within the emergency pandemic restrictions.
- To re-build our in-church services of worship and other face-to-face ministries.
- To learn more deeply what the priorities for our future ministry should be, taking into account the opportunities and resources open to us.
- To plan and work for recovery and further growth in both churches
- To further develop St Mary's role in the town of Bury St Edmunds and to see this more deeply integrated into the understanding and awareness of church members as a significant aspect of mission.
- To further improve communications through all media, to ensure that we give clear and positive messages to a wide audience.
- To continue the pioneering work in partnership with Westgate School and work with young families, even as it has been necessary to make the post of Children's and Families Worker redundant from March 2021.
- To make a positive contribution to the Deanery of Thingoe, in a period in which twothirds of stipendiary clergy posts are vacant.
- To work as part of the Heritage Partnership to celebrate the millennium of the founding of the Abbey of St Edmund without jeopardising the distinct identity and role of St Mary's in the town.
- To develop the music ministry at St Mary's through the appointment of a Director of Music.
- To respond to the challenge of reducing capacities in our volunteer base.
- To reassess the development of an enlarged building at St Peter's Church.
- To reassess the development of the west end interior of St Mary's Church.
- To reassess for the renovation the School Hall and Sawbridge Hall in the Hyndman Centre, which will necessitate the closure of the centre.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England & Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations and the Church Accounting Regulations 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In so far as the trustees are aware:

- there is no relevant audit information of which the charity's independent examiners are unaware; and
- the trustees have taken all steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant information and to establish that the independent examiners are aware of that information.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ending 31 December 2020

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the current Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities and applicable accounting standard FRS 102.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention except for investment assets, which are shown at market value. The financial statements include transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of any church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Fund accounting

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available to be spent on the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also unrestricted. The unrestricted funds of each of St Mary's and St Peter's Churches are, in practice, restricted to the furtherance of mission primarily as decided by the District Council of each respective Church.

Restricted funds are those funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions are provided in the notes to the financial statements. Endowment funds, where the capital must be retained, are explained in note 17.

Incoming Resources

Donations and legacies

Planned giving, collections and similar donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds are recognised in the final amount claimable for the tax year ending in the period of accounts plus an iterim claim in respect of the next following tax year. Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted when the PCC is entitled to the use of the resources, their ultimate receipt is considered reasonably certain and the amounts due are readily quantifiable.

Income from other trading activities

Funds raised by letting the Hyndman Centre (parish hall), fund raising events and sales of cards and guides from the church bookstall are accounted for gross.

Income from investment

Dividends and interest are accounted for when declared receivable.

Income from Charitable Activities

Income is recognised for the period in which it is earned.

Resources used

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the PCC.

1 Accounting Policies (Continued)

Activities directly related to the work of the Church

The diocesan parish share expected to be paid over is accounted for when due.

Other expenditure

All other expenditure is recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains and losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from the accounts by s. 10(2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

Movable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal, are accounted for as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's Inventory which can be inspected at any reasonable time. For inalienable property acquired prior to 2001, there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the accounts. Items acquired since 1 January 2001 have been capitalised and depreciated in the accounts over their currently anticipated useful economic life on a straight line basis.

All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under £2,500 or on the repair of movable church furnishings acquired before 1 January 2001 is written off.

Other land and buildings

The Hyndman Centre is shown at valuation so as to conform with SORP issued on 16 July 2014. Prior to SORP 2005 it was excluded since the PCC has a policy of long term retention of these assets. These assets are included at valuation on the balance sheet since reliable cost information is not available. Any expenditure on maintenance is written off as incurred.

Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight line basis over 4 years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December.

Current assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rent or other income are shown as debtors less any provision for amounts that may prove uncollectible.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church of England Deposit Fund or at the bank.

During the year the PCC employed at St Mary's a Director of Music, an assistant organist, a choir leader, two parish administrators, a caretaker and a cleaner. The PCC also employed a cleaner at the Hyndman Centre. A family worker was appointed during 2017 at St Peter's on a fixed term contract to be financed from the Daphne Swatman bequest. The full time parish administrator was employed partly on work related to St Peter's and the Hyndman Centre.

All employees but two were part time and all earned below £60,000 pa.

The average number of full time equivalent employees for the year for the Parish was 4.

Costs reported in this notes were as reduced by £15,831 (2019 nil) claimed under the HMRC Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme

Employers' National Insurance costs amounting to £1,227 (2019 £2,274) were included in the costs reported in this note.

Employers' occupational pension costs under a defined contribution scheme with NEST amounted to £3,836 (2019 £3,372).

The salaries paid in the year to PCC employees who were also members of PCC or close family of such members were as follows: Administrator Mrs J Crofts (formerly Mrs J Post) £22,592.

The salary of the Administrator is set by St Mary's Finance Committee. Mrs J Crofts is not a member of that committee.

The salaries are endorsed by the PCC. Mrs J Crofts disqualifies herself from consideration by the PCC of her salary.

Six members of the PCC were reimbursed travelling, telephone and other expenses totalling £2,813.

The Hyndman Centre has been included at a valuation as at 31 December 2005 together with expenditure on work on the extension to the Centre. The valuation was carried out by Tony Redman, MA, BSc, FRICS, IHBC. His qualification to carry out this valuation is as a partner in the firm of Whitworth Co-Partnership, Chartered Architects and Surveyors.

The basis of valuation is to value the PCC's freehold interest in the School Unit, car park and orchard at Hospital Road Bury St Edmunds on a "value in use" basis. The valuation excludes the consecrated ground and the structure of St Peter's Church. It recognises that the use of the site is limited to any ecclesiastical purpose affecting the parish and any purposes in connection with educational schemes for providing facilities for the spiritual moral and physical training of persons residing in or near the parish. The title to the site is held as custodian trustee by the Diocesan Board of Finance.

There are no surviving records of the historical cost of this site.

It was not valued prior to 2005, since, under SORP 1995, it has been excluded from the Balance Sheet by reason of its having been regarded as an "historic asset".

Depreciation has not been charged in respect of the Hyndman Centre. This is in the context of the potential depreciation charge and the accumulated depreciation not being material because the estimated residual value of the asset is not materially different from the carrying amount of the asset. The asset has been subject to an impairment review. That review has concluded that the net realisable value is not lower than the net book value.

20 Restatements made to 2019 financial statements

The following restatement has been made to the 2019 financial statements approved by the PCC on 14 April 2020. The fund balances at 31 December 2019 referred to at Note 5 have been restated to decrease the General Fund by £1,000 to become £25,565 and to increase the Daphne Swatman Mission balance by £1,000 to become £42,374. This restatement has been made to implement the transfer between those funds reported at Note 9. This restatement has no affect on the total unrestricted fund balances of St Peter's or the Parish and has no affect on the Statement of Financial Activities, Balance Sheet or Cash Flow Statement approved by the PCC on 14 April 2020.

21 PCC responsibilities for repair

No general provision has been made in the accounts for liabilities to maintain the Church buildings.

During the early part of 2020 substantial repairs were carried out to parts of the stone floor slabs in St Mary's church. Some matters remain outstanding from the report of the quinquennial inspection of the church carried out in 2016, including various stonework, roof, rainwater goods and woodwork repairs. The church architect was requested to draw up proposals to tender for these works, which are expected to cost approximately £30,000 in total, but this work has been delayed because of the pandemic. Plans to reorder the West End of the church to better meet its needs are unlikely to be progressed in the short term.

A quinquennial inspection of St Peter's church was carried out December 2016. No priority major repair works were identified. The report has been considered, evaluated and appropriate repair works have been completed. In 2020 a new video and screen system was installed, financed through the Fabric Fund. The plans for the new extension to the main building have been revised and the church will now seek outline planning permission.

Work was completed in 2013 on a major scheme affecting the structure of the Hyndman Centre. Further refurbishment and security work was carried out in 2019. Further refurbishment is expected in future years dependent on available resources.

22 Material transactions with members of the PCC

Other than the remuneration and benefits referred to in note 7 above, there have been no material transactions undertaken in the name of or on behalf of the PCC in which any person connected with the PCC has a material interest. The total income donated by members of the PCC amounted to £43,138. This amount does not include recurrent recoveries of tax under the Gift Aid provisions, which are estimated to amount to £10,785.

23 Remuneration of auditor/independent examiner

Robin Jackson, director of Churchgate Accountants, Bury St Edmunds has acted as independent examiner of the 2020 financial statements.

These statements contain a cost of £200 in respect of Independent Examination of the 2019 financial statements and report and a provision of £200 in respect of Independent Examination for 2020. In both cases the £200 was the net cost to the PCC; that net cost was made up of a charge of £1,200, reduced by a donation of £1,000 to the PCC by the Independent Examiner.

No fees were paid to the independent examiner in respect of any other services rendered to the PCC.

24 Insurance of buildings

The insurance cover of the buildings and contents at January 2020 were as follows: St Mary's Church £34,370,144, St Peter's Church £3,529,352 and Hyndman Centre £1,697,794.

The valuations were based on surveys carried out in 2014 and include improvement work at the Hyndman Centre. Insurance cover is 100% of the valuations of St Mary's, St Peter's and the Hyndman Centre.

Independent Examiner's Report to the trustees of St Mary's with St Peter's Parochial Church Council

I report on the accounts of St Mary's with St Peter's Parochial Church Council for the year ended 31 December 2020, which are set out on pages 1 to 24.

This report is made solely to the trustees, as a body, in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. My work has been undertaken so that I might state to the charity's trustees those matters I am required to state to them in an independent examiner's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and the charity's trustees as a body, for my work, for this report, or for the opinions I have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of the ICAEW.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act;
- follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement

In connection with my examination, no material matters have come to my attention which gives me cause to believe that in, any material respect:

- the accounting records were not kept in accordance with section 130 of the Charities Act; or
- the accounts did not accord with the accounting records; or
- the accounts did not comply with the applicable requirements concerning the form and content of accounts set out in the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 other than any requirement that the accounts give a 'true and fair' view which is not a matter considered as part of an independent examination.

I have come across no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in this report in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
