

## The hub church Portland Road, Bishop's Stortford, Herts, CM233SL 07788612398

Annual Report for the year ending 31 August 2020.

1. Trustees. Mr A Hickman, Mr J Baxter served for the whole year and Miss Evelyn Ibekeh-Olasegha joined in March 2020.

2. Purpose of the Charity. Throughout the report period, this charity has continued to promote the Christian Faith in Bishop's Stortford. The congregation includes Portuguese, Bulgarian and Polish people living in the area plus Brazilians and other nationalities who have joined the church. The English Language School for the training of missionaries from Brazil which started in January 2007 continues to operate mostly with students from Europe and the UK. During the school year (up to 31 August 2020) we had 12 students in three classes. We have continued to help individuals with needs, within Bishop's Stortford or the surrounding area when brought to our attention. During the report period, the building has continued to host the Portland Child Contact Centre up to when the first lockdown occurred in March 2020 and has remained closed since. When open it fills a useful need in the community. The Contact Centre provides a safe environment where solicitors and social services can arrange for children to meet with a separated parent on a regular basis, if necessary. Local people including dance classes, a camera club, a children's activity group and a national slimming club continued to hire the building until lockdown in March 2020 and have remained closed since apart from the period in the summer when allowed but rents are considerably lower then previously.

3. Report of progress towards our aims. As stated above, we continue to operate the Language school for 3 days a week. Weekends are used for the contact centre for broken families and church services on Sunday. Local community groups use the hall in the evenings when the church is not holding meetings. Mission trips have been largely on hold. The babies and toddlers group regularly has up to 20 mums with their children in attendance which brings in a small amount of finance but this has also been closed since March 2020 lockdown.

In addition to our normal activities, due to the virus outbreak many halls that supported AA groups stopped allowing them but since we have a number of AA contacts it was decided to start holding these in our centre from 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2020 when the government gave us permission. This helps in a small way with finances.
