Basis of preparation and legal framework

The Charity's annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 August 2020 have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities; Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2019) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)).

The governing document is the Deed of Union (1932) adopted September 1932 and the Methodist Church Act (1976).

1. Administrative Details

- 1.1 Christchurch and Wimborne Circuit is a registered charity 1148455. The Circuit is a separate legal entity within the Methodist Church and is required under Charity law to prepare separate accounts
- 1.2 The members of the Circuit Meeting are the managing trustees of the Circuit.
 Managing Trustees are appointed in accordance with SO 510 of The Constitution and Discipline of The Methodist Church
- 1.3 The Circuit Meeting comprises all ordained ministers, circuit stewards and other officers and representatives from all churches within the Circuit. A full list of trustees is shown in Appendix A
- 1.4 Custodian Trustees are The Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes, Central Buildings, Oldham Street, Manchester M1 1JQ
- 1.5 The Circuit's registered address is 29 Lacy Drive, Wimborne BH21 1AY
- 1.6 The Circuit's independent examiners are Knight Goodhead Limited, Chandler's Ford
- 1.7 The Circuit's bankers are: CAF Bank Ltd, 25 Kings Hill Road, Kings Hill, West Malling, ME19 4JQ and The Central Finance Board of the Methodist Church, 9 Bonhill Street, London EC2A 4PE
- 1.8 The Circuit engages advisers for legal affairs and property services as required

2. Structure governance and management

- 2.1 The Circuit is governed in accordance with the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church; its organisation is structured around the circuit meeting that meets at least twice a year. Only one meeting has been possible during the year due to the pandemic.
- 2.2 The circuit meeting is supported by regular meetings of the Circuit Leadership Team (CLT) who have met virtually since March 2020 to conduct day-to-day business and considers matters to be brought to the circuit meeting. The CLT consists of all active ordained ministers and the circuit stewards and circuit administrator.
- 2.3 The Local Preachers meeting is held quarterly to consider the worship life of the church and consists of all ordained ministers, local preachers, and worship leaders. Since March this has been a virtual meeting
- 2.4 The Circuit Meeting may also set up other groups and committees to deal with specific tasks that may arise.

3. Objectives and Activities

The purposes of the Methodist Church are and shall be deemed to have been since the date of the Deed of Union the advancement of - (A) the Christian faith in accordance with the doctrinal standards and the discipline of the Methodist Church; (B) any charitable purpose for the time being of any Connexional, District, Circuit local or other organisation of the Methodist Church, (C) any charitable purpose for the time being of any society or institution subsidiary or ancillary to the Methodist Church, (D) any purpose for the time being of any charity being a charity subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church

- 3.2 The Circuit's principle objectives and activities are to enable its churches to work towards their vision of deepening their Christian faith and to reach out to others by sharing the good news of Jesus Christ
- 3.3 The circuit provides staff. Preachers, education, and pastoral oversight which enables the local churches to provide Christian worship. Spiritual development and pastoral care both to church members and the wider community
- 3.4 The circuit agrees property and financial policies that help churches focus on their core business: building the kingdom of God through transformed lives as Disciples of Christ
- 3.5 The Circuit promotes the 2 pillars of Methodism social holiness, by encouraging its members to make disciples and to work for social justice.
- 3.6 The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commissions general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives

4. Mission Statement

In 2018 the circuit adopted a new Mission Statement

5. Achievements and performance and future

- 5.1 The whole work of the circuit this year has been difficult due to the Covid-19 pandemic which meant all churches were closed for worship and other activities from March until the end of August. This has placed on hold many of the plans envisaged for 2019/20 and beyond
 - However most churches have found various was of communicating and provided virtual services and pastoral support to the church community. Many churches will be gradually opening from September 2020 but this may well result in many new ways of working. It could be many months before we a clear picture for the future.
- 5.2 The Circuit has a strong and effective ministerial and lay leadership who have managed to operate virtually during the pandemic.

Staffing

- Rev Pauline Crispin joined the circuit as Superintendent on 1st September 2019
- Dan Desmond Schools Worker left in September and was not replaced but consideration will be given for a Family worker at Verwood
- The Lay Workers in Ringwood, Wimborne and Blandford are providing valuable support to their sections.
- Rev David Ellis left his part time role on 31st August 2020
- Consideration is being given for a Children and Families Worker in Wimborne
- The churches across the circuit normally have various activities but these have not operated since March 2020 other than approved under government guidelines such as pre-schools

Property

 The Verwood major development has been placed on hold as funding may prove difficult in the short term as connexional grants have been stopped. The circuit still has £50K earmarked for any development

- Witchampton -the preschool have now vacated the premises and we await planning permission for residential use.
- 5.3 All church premises well maintained, and All Quinquennial inspections are up to date.
- 5.4 The circuit manses are all well maintained
- 5.5 The circuit continues to benefit from the work of the local preachers and those in training
- 5.6 Safeguarding Training has been implemented across the circuit

6. Financial Review

- 6.1 At 31st August 2020 the unrestricted funds of the Circuit totalled £120,268 excluding properties and the Model Trust fund
- 6.2 At 31st August 2020 the Circuit held the following unrestricted funds

6.3 The Circuit also owns Freehold Property valued by the trustees at £2,310,000

7. Grants Policy

Normal property grants 10% of cost up to a maximum of £10,000. Grants above that level are subject to special consideration by the Circuit Meeting

Mission and Outreach project grants churches are expected to meet at least 50% of the cost.

Due to the lockdown of church premises the circuit will have to provide grants to those churches whose income from giving and lettings has been severely affected by the closure

8. Risk Management

Income and Expenditure is being monitored in total and is compared with the approved annual budget on a half yearly basis to detect trends as part of the risk management process to avoid unforeseen calls on reserves.

9. Safeguarding

Every person has a value and dignity which comes directly from the creation of male and female in God's own image and likeness. Christians see this potential as fulfilled by God's re-creation of us in Christ. Among other things this implies a duty to value all people as bearing the image of God and therefore to protect them from harm.

The Christchurch & Wimborne Circuit commits itself to ensuring the implementation of Connexional Safeguarding Policy, government legislation, guidance, and safe practice in the circuit and in the churches.

The Christchurch & Wimborne Circuit commits itself to the provision of support, advice and training for lay and ordained people that will ensure people are clear and confident about their roles and responsibilities in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults who may be vulnerable.

10. Reserves Policy

- 10.1 The Circuit's objectives and activities are to facilitate sharing of resources amongst the local churches to empower them to function as effective, witness, mission, and caring centres
- 10.2 To do this the Circuit
 - · Provides ministerial oversight for the 15 churches within the Circuit
 - Employs a team of lay employees to support the activities of the Circuit
 - Maintains a portfolio of manses across the circuit to provide residential accommodation for ministers. Surplus accommodation is tenanted to generate income for investment in the manse portfolio.
- 10.3 The activities are funded by assessments on the churches in the Circuit which are reviewed annually
- 10.4 In setting its budget for the year the Circuit Meeting considers the projected impact of changes in staffing levels.
- 10.5 The current level of general reserves and manse fund reserves are currently £125,108 giving the circuit ample funds to meet commitments over the coming year including the maintenance of manses
- Taking into consideration all the above factors the circuit needs to hold in the combined general and property funds of £100,000 being 3 months expenditure.
- 10.7 The Shorey Fund at £19,655 is used for general development work across the circuit and the current balance will be used over the next 2 years.
- 10.8 Model Trust Fund at £304,801 is held as a reserve to cover major personnel and property expense £50,000 has been allocated for the Verwood redevelopment. For 20/21 £35,000 has been allocated to support staff appointments. A full staffing review will take into consideration the current balance on the fund
- 10.9 Witchampton Fund £140 this fund will no longer be required as the premises are to be sold.

1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with FRS 102 (effective from 1 January 2019) - the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

2 Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the Circuit which are Unrestricted. The Circuit Model Trust Fund has wide purposes defined in Standing Orders and is categorised as unrestricted. There are also Designated funds which have been earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes within Unrestricted funds. Details of each material fund are disclosed in note 20. Any funds may be represented by more than just cash.

3 Accounting policies

Rasis

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

Based on the monetary assets and human resources available to the Circuit at 31st August 2020 the trustees believe the Circuit is a going concern after taking into account the current risks to going concern due to the ongoing COVID-19 issue as detailed in the Trustee Report.

Income Recognition

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources, it is probable we will they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred or a constructive obligation arises and the outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely than not, committing the Circuit to pay out resources.

Grants

Grants made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the time of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than one year the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

VAT

Since the Circuit is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the Circuit

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and individually cost more than £1,000. The freehold property is shown in the accounts at 2016 deemed values, of which the land component is deemed to be £740,000. The Witchampton Church, now a circuit asset has been given a nominal valuation of £80,000 until the professional advisors have assessed future viability. No depreciation is provided on the building because the trustees consider the current residual fair value of the manse buildings to be not less than its market value. Any depreciation would not be material. The properties have been reviewed for impairment

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Pensions

Most ordained presbyters and deacons are members of the Methodist Ministers' Pension Scheme (MMPS). This is a defined benefit scheme. The Supreme Court held in 2014 that Methodist Ministers are not employees of the Church. For simplicity when dealing with National Insurance Contributions and pension contributions the terms 'employer' and 'employee' are used as they would be in an employing body. The Connexion accounts the MMPS as a pension scheme and shows the figures in the annual Methodist Church in Great Britain accounts.

On the other hand lay employees are contractually employees and have the option of joining a pension scheme. The Circuit uses the NEST scheme for lay employees contributing 6% for both employer and employee contributions.
