#### CELESTIAL CHURCH OF CHRIST HOREB OF GOD PARISH Trustees' Report

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and applicable law.

#### Structure, governance and management

Horeb Of God Parish Church is governed by an Approved Governing Document which states that the principal purpose of the church is the advancement of the Christian Faith according to the principles of the Worldwide Celestial Church Of Christ to include the advancement of education, community service and such other general charitable purposes in such parts of the United Kingdom and the world as the Church shall determine.

Horeb of God Parish is a rented Property and we are striving to buy a property that will help to maximize our charitable functions (training, educational and seminars). Members of the Church are accepted in accordance with the Constitution which requires to be baptized after one Year

Members are encouraged to take an appropriate part in the spiritual and practical tasks involved in furtherance of the charitable objective.

Relevant matters may be submitted to the Church meeting by the Trustees for guidance, or may be raised by members in Church meeting for further consideration by the Trustee.

Though the Constitution permits decisions to be made at Church meetings by appropriate majorities, the Church seeks to work by consensus wherever possible.

In order to achieve the principal objective which is set out above, the Church provides a variety of activities both to its membership and to the community generally. The aim is to show the love of Jesus Christ in both word and deed and to bring people into a closer relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ as living Lord.

Central to the work and witness of the Church is the provision of regular public services of Christian worship. These services take place each Sunday 10:00am, Wednesday 7:00pm and Bible Class After Friday: 7:00pm

There are also occasional services at other times which are advertised on the Church Notice Board.

There is a full children's programme during the Sunday services.

The church seeks to be a friendly and welcoming community and anybody is free to attend any of these services and Seminars.

The 3rd Sundays of the Month is set aside for full Youth Participation in Sermon, Evangelical and Prophetic Services and Seminars.

The Church runs a series of house groups for the growth of faith and discipleship in the homes of some members, and further details of these can be obtained from the Trustees on request, or at the Sunday services of worship.

The Church operates systems to ensure that all people working with children and vulnerable adults are appropriately vetted with regard to the Criminal Records Bureau.

The church has read the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, and is satisfied that the activities outlined above clearly demonstrate that the charity is providing a benefit to the public.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

Once again, we have entered another year and we hope and have faith that the good Lord will see us through as he has always done.

I take this opportunity to thank all those who have done their personal best in making sure that this foundation has been kept going despite the many hurdles that we faced. Principal amongst these is finance.

Our charity status demands that we function more effectively, in the means of reaching out to both our immediate and overseas communities.

There is a greater need which are very pressing in the following areas:

Adolescent issues in the black community

- 1. Women and single parenting
- 2. Elderly care
- 3. Homelessness

Statistics both locally and nationally paint different images in comparison to the reality of these situations in the communities. We can never truly see the impact of these issues unless we are present in these areas ourselves.

I believe that it's time for us as a charity organisation to look further field for support from other well-meaning organisations as to ease the burden on our own financial situation.

Once again, I know all of us are doing our best and we should not be daunted by the enormity of the challenge that we face.

Over the years CCC Horeb Of God Parish, has focused its attention not only on the spiritual growth of its members but also on their personal, psychological and social wellbeing. This is made more prominent because of modern day challenges that is facing not only the adults but children and youths of today.

We see it as our spiritual obligation to see to the wellbeing of our members principally in supporting them in areas they cannot access.

There is a great rise in nervous breakdown and mental breakdown and such like challenges that people face today, and help is non-existent or not adequate, therefore the church as a charity entity is a sanctuary that people run to as their last result.

Horeb of God Parish has been blessed with able bodied men and women who are professionals in their own calling bringing in their expertise to help and assist whenever it is needed. We can assert that we are overstretched this year and that we are cash strapped as a result, what with the cost of running the church vis a vis rent, stipend and bills. But as a church we cannot fold our hands and feel unconcerned.

We cannot just pray for harvest. We must extend and spread nets to uncharted waters to seek for help before the situation get worse.

Other activities within the CHURCH comprise of both adult male and female in educating and assisting whenever the need arises.

Our outreach programmes in the last year got good recommendation because we cannot only be inward working but also impact our immediate and distance environment and hence, we embark on feeding the Vulnerable in the community (food bank).

## UPDATES ON CHARITY WORK IN Nigeria

We Shipped Clothing, Food and Toys and Children Books of Educational Materials to Nigeria and continually sponsoring 3 Children in School in the Last 5 Years and 2 pupils gained admission to study petroleum engineering and agricultural engineering respectively and hence increased financial responsibility to the beneficiaries and the 3rd beneficiary is telling us she wants to study medicine. We also feed in the East London Community.

#### CHURCH PROPERTY -

We cannot but emphasise the importance of having a building of our own whereby we can compartmentalize departments day center, weekend coaching and food bank which are relevant to our functions.

The financial results for the year, together with a summary of the accounting policies adopted are set out in the accompanying financial statements.

The Trustees have established a Reserves Policy, and are still struggling to have sufficient fund to run the Church, but with ongoing income anticipated, to enable the church to function effectively in the coming year.

The Trustees have made an assessment of the major risks facing the church, and are satisfied that there are policies in place to minimise these risks.

#### 1. Accounting Policies

#### 1.1) Accounting Convention

The Financial Statements has been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable UK Accounting Standards and also with the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice (SORP 2005) Accounting and Reporting by Charities - issued in March 2005.

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption of Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirements to produce a Cash Flow Statement on the ground that it qualifies as a small charity.

#### 1.2) Fund Accounting

General unrestricted funds represent unrestricted income, which is expendable at the discretion of the Trustees in the furtherance of the objects of the charity

#### 1.3) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalized and included at cost including any incidental cost

Depreciation is calculated on the fixed assets to write off the cost of the assets less their residual values, in equal instalments over their expected useful economic lives. The annual rate in use is 25% per annum.

#### 1.4) Incoming Resources

Income is mainly from Tithes and Offering, Building funds. Gift Aid, grant and bank interest received are included in the financial statements when received.

#### 1.5) Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

#### 1.6) Taxation

As a charity, the charitable funds are exempt from corporation tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is, in accordance with standard accounting practice, included in the cost of those items to which it relates.
