Para 1.20	In summary for the year: 3585 freshly cooked frozen meals delivered to people who were shielding during the pandemic. 48 People who were lonely and isolated were phoned at least weekly by a befriender. 1,362 deliveries of shopping, and prescriptions were delivered to people's homes for those who were shielding. During 2020 HTL set up a Community Helpline and received a total of 2042 calls from people who needed help and support during the pandemic. This phone line continues to be answered six days per week.
