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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 October 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

JM-CA (1931) Charity is committed to enabling as many people as possible to worship at our church and to become part of our Johane Masowe-Chishanu Apostles (1931) (or JM-CA (1931)) community, maintaining an overview of worship throughout the Church and making suggestions on how our services can involve in view of the diversity of the community groups that live within our church localities.

Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer, preaching and singing. In particular we try to help ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our JM-CA (1931) community through:

- Worship and Prayer; learning about the Gospel and developing their knowledge and trust in Jesus.
- · Family values, support and encouragement.
- · Missionary and outreach programme.

The principal activities in the period were:

- Preaching and spreading the word of God to the members and non-members in the UK and abroad;
- · Fulfilling goals as set out by the Holy Spirit;
- Teaching and encouraging the adherence to the Ten Commandments;
- Encouraging co-operation, fellowship and unity amongst members of the Church and the communities;
- · Facilitating and encouraging self-help projects.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Achievements and performance Worship and Prayer

JM-CA (1931) offers regular Sunday services and once a month evening prayer service over the course of the year that our community find both beneficial and spiritually fulfilling.

For the fourth success year running, this year we welcomed more families into our church and we continued to have monthly planning meetings. These continued to be well received.

We continued with outreach worship programmes to other communities inside and outside the UK. Several church members travelled to Republic of Ireland, Spain, and Ecuador as part of missionary and outreach work. In 2019 we're scheduled for Panama and Costa Rica missionary and outreach trips. In addition, our church youth (12-35yrs) are scheduled to travel to Guernsey for a spiritual retreat.

Church Administration

As part of the management and administration of the Charity in the reporting period the Trustees undertook the following:

- Engagement of accountants and solicitors to assist and guide the Trustees in the development of good church administration through management policies and procedures, in line with national guidance to ensure the Charity complies with the UK charity regulation.
- Sought professional advice to prepare our annual accounts and financial statement to ensure our charity complies with the Charity Commission regulation and uphold transparency.
- Continues with the awareness initiatives for the membership regarding the compliance, accountability, security and democracy issues specifically with the Charity Commission and the UK in general.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Review of the Financial Statements

Johane Masowe-Chishanu Apostles (1931) reported a surplus of £186 (2018: £1,756) during the year.

Receipts

Receipts totalling £42,031 (2018: £36,454) was from voluntary member donations in the form of unrestricted funds of which £11,471 (2018: £11,115) was used to pay the hiring of local venues and transportation services and £30,374 (2018: £23,583) was spent on our missionary campaign and outreach programmes. There were no external grants or donations made as can be seen in the Financial Statements.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, governance and management

Johane Masowe-Chishanu Apostles (1931) Charity is a membership association governed by its Constitution dated 28 April 2013. The Charity was registered as a Charity (No. 1152626) with the Charity Commission on 27th June 2013.

The Charity does not employ any staff but is run by a board of Trustees within the guidance of the Constitution. Trustees are appointed by Church membership in accordance with the Constitution and do not receive any salary or payment.

The Charity comprises local Church Congregations, known as Sowes, to allow membership to attend religious activities and church services in different localities such as in Kettering, Hatfield, Bristol, Derby and Birmingham. The religious activities and local Sunday church services are attended by church members and also non-church members who are willing to receive the word of God and spiritual healing.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charity is governed by a board of trustees. This is to ensure that the board has the skills and experience required to oversee the management of the charity and its operations. The Charity trustees are responsible for general control and management of the charity. The trustees give their time freely and receive no remuneration or other financial benefits.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new trustees receive a planned induction programme before taking up their place on the board. This includes an explanation of their roles and responsibilities, an introduction to other trustees, an overview of recent activities and an explanation of broad format and process.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 October 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
