The charity is currently governed by a board of trustees who volunteered their time during the first year of the charity being set up – and before it was possible to physically open the shed fully and attract members. The first AGM, to be held in March 2021, will allow our members to elect their trustees as per our constitution, however it is likely that this will have to be done virtually. The charity is a member of the UK Men's Shed Association, which provides guidance and advice for local Shed group trustees.

To promote good health and wellbeing to its members through the active participation and, from time to time, providing opportunities for relevant health organisations to raise awareness of good health strategies for the benefit of the Shed.

The trustees have considered the Charity Commission's Guidance on Public Benefit (Section 17(5) of the Charities Act and the Charities Reports and Regulations 2008) in deciding on the Wilton Men's Shed's activities. In the year to May 2020 all of the efforts of the charity were to ensure the building of the shed was funded and completed as far as we were able, pandemic restrictions notwithstanding.

Volunteers

Without volunteers the charity would not exist. It is solely thanks to their efforts that we now have a fully functioning building and can begin to develop and realise our plans for the future. The WhatsApp Group set up in April 2019, through which much of the work was co-ordinated by trustee Peter Edge, has had between 20 and 40 members. This will form the basis for our membership going forward, mindful that we will need to use all mediums – including paper and word of mouth – to attract new members.

Volunteers have led on every aspect of the build; indeed it is only the electrics where we expect to have to pay for professional help. From laying concrete, securing guttering, installing partitioning, and putting in a toilet and kitchen/meeting room, volunteers have freely given their time and goodwill.

Achievements and performance

The concept of a Men's Shed in Wilton was first discussed by the Wilton Community Land Trust (WCLT) some five years before it became a reality. Initially intended to be located at the Enterprise Hub on the Wilton Hill development, the decision to base the charity in the centre of Wilton in a purpose built shed was taken in early 2019. On the 25th June 2019 Wilton Men's Shed was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation with the Charity Commission.

The three founding trustees then set about adopting a constitution, identifying a site and securing funding. We are very grateful to the Army Covenant Fund for the initial seed funding which paid for the pre-fabricated steel frame building (via WCLT), to Wilton Town Council for granting a lease on land behind the sports pavilion on Castle Meadow and to the WCLT for their help both in setting up the Wilton Men's Shed and in helping with grants.

After a few hiccups with planning the Wilton Men's Shed got the green light from Wiltshire Council Planning Department in early 2020. The Shed was built entirely by volunteers, who braved gale force winds and rain in January 2021 to make the building secure and who gave up an estimated 700 hours of their time for free. Without them it would not have been possible to complete the build and the trustees are hugely grateful.

Social media has been enormously helpful, including a dedicated website, Facebook and WhatsApp. We have also begun to forge partnerships with, amongst others, Wilton Help, Seeds for Success and Wilton Wildlife Group (who have plans to plant a wildflower meadow at the front of the building). Meetings have also taken place with representatives from the Veteran's Centre on Wilton Hill on how we can successfully work with their tenants and with local healthcare provider Salisbury Medical Practice.

After securing planning and making the building weather secure we were hit by the first lockdown in March 2020. The time lost working on the Shed was made up over the summer by volunteers who, adhering to government guidelines, sorted out (amongst other things) partitioning, plaster boarding, painting the floor, plumbing and racking out.

We are very grateful to all our supporters, who apart from huge amounts of time have also given an enormous quantity of useful tools, furniture and equipment. S Morris provided pro bono the concrete for the base – which alone would have cost around £2,500. We have also benefitted from grants and donations from Wilton Community Land Trust, Wiltshire Community Foundation, Wilton Town Council, Wilton Rotary Club, Bluebird Care and the Wilton Mayor Appeal. Our thanks to you all.
