Introduction

This has been a difficult year for the Methodist Circuit, as we seek to adapt to a world of Covid-19, where our chapels have largely been closed. We have offered support to each place of worship in such challenging times. Alongside our commitment to being "A Discipleship Movement Shaped for Mission", we have opened conversations with a neighbouring circuit which may lead to our amalgamation.

Aims and organisation

The calling of the Methodist Church is:

- •To increase awareness of God's presence and to celebrate God's love.
- •To help people to grow and learn as Christians, through mutual support and care.
- To be a good neighbour to people in need and to challenge injustice.
- •To make more followers of Jesus Christ.

Review of the year

Income trends

Circuit income is primarily drawn from the assessment paid by the Circuit churches. All churches have managed to pay their full allocation of the assessment, which is calculated through an agreed formula. Covid-19 has brought a large degree of uncertainty into our financial planning. We are in regular touch with local church treasurers to understand their financial situation and how that is likely in impact the wider circuit.

The lettings income relates to the rental of a manse.

Expenditure trends

Stipend expenditure has increased each financial year in line with conference approved increases.

A significant element of expenditure is the Circuit contribution to the District and Connexion, of which a significant part is used to fund the work of the wider Methodist Church.

The plans for a new church building in Newquay have continued to be frustrated during the year. It remains unclear how we will further the work in this community. This is not helped by often being unable to meet face-to-face. The situation is under continual review by a committee of members from the Newquay society and the wider circuit.

<u>Coronavirus</u>

The impact of Covid-19 on the finances of the Circuit has been limited. Local chapels are facing the brunt of the drop in income, although in most places people are still able to make their contributions. All assessment amounts were received within the financial year in question, and continue to be received into 2021. The Cornwall & Isles of Scilly District of the Methodist Church have arranged for small loans to be made to Circuits should these be required for cashflow purposes. At this present moment in time we are not in receipt of any such loan, however the Circuit did receive funds in the year ended 31 August 2020 from the Government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme to help cover wage costs.

Plans for 2020/21

Circuit financial plans for the coming year have been prepared on the basis that there remain 2 full time ordained staff with anticipated cost of living stipend increases combined with an increase in the assessment paid to the District such that on average a 2.0% assessment increase has been requested from the Circuit churches. Each chapel has been able to contribute their share of the assessment, even when they are not able to meet together for corporate worship. However, we are aware of the pressures on the finances of each society, and we continue to monitor our financial situation accordingly.

Trustees for Methodist Church purposes

Aims and organisation

The charity objective is to act as a resource provider within the area around Newquay, Perranporth & St Agnes for the Methodist Church.

The purposes of the Methodist Church are and shall be deemed to have been since the Date of Union the advancement of:

- a) The Christian faith in accordance with the doctrinal standards and discipline of The Methodist Church;
- b) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any Connexional, District, Circuit, local or other organisation of The Methodist Church;
- c) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any society or institution subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church;
- d) Any purpose for the time being of any charity being a charity subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church.

The activities of the Circuit include:

The organisation and resourcing of regular public acts of worship open to members of the church and non-members alike.

The teaching of Christianity through sermons, courses and small groups.

The resourcing of pastoral work including visiting the sick and bereaved.

Taking religious assemblies in local schools.

The building up of community activities open to all.

Promotion of Christianity through the staging of events and services.

Public Benefit

We confirm the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Structure, Governance and Management

Detailed governance arrangements are outlined within the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church by order of the annual conference (CPD).

Day to day management of the Circuit is undertaken by the Circuit Leadership team along with the Local Preachers meeting, the Circuit Meeting.

Trustee Training

A range of guidance produced by Methodist Connexion to support the effective running of the circuit, specifically the leaflet 'The Role of a Trustee in The Methodist Church' is given to all new Circuit meeting members as induction to their role as trustees.

Related Parties

The Circuit is part of the Cornwall & Isles of Scilly District and is also accountable to the Methodist Conference.

The following Methodist Churches are linked to the circuit: St Agnes, Perranporth, Mount Hawke, Rose, Newquay, Crantock, Cubert & St Newlyn East

Risk Management

The major risks have been identified and recorded by the Circuit Leadership Team with professional advice taken as required.

There is a regular annual review process undertaken and recorded.

Income and Expenditure is being monitored in total and is compared with the approved annual budget on a quarterly basis (at each Circuit Meeting) to detect trends as part of the risk management process to avoid unforeseen calls on reserves.

Safeguarding

Every person has a value and dignity which comes directly from the creation of male and female in God's own image and likeness. Christians see this potential as fulfilled by God's re-creation of us in Christ. Among other things this implies a duty to value all people as bearing the image of God and therefore to protect them from harm.

Methodist Connexional practice outlines commitment to the following principles:

- The care and nurture of, and respectful pastoral ministry with, all children, young people and adults
- The safeguarding and protection of all children, young people and adults when they are vulnerable
- The establishing of safe, caring communities which provide a loving environment where there is informed vigilance as to the dangers of abuse.
- We will carefully select and train all those with any responsibility within the Church, in line with Safer Recruitment principles, including the use of criminal records disclosures and registration with the relevant vetting and barring schemes.
- We will respond without delay to every complaint made which suggests that an adult, child or young person may have been harmed, cooperating with the police and local authority in any investigation.
- We will seek to work with anyone who has suffered abuse, developing with them an appropriate ministry of informed pastoral care.
- We will seek to challenge any abuse of power, especially by anyone in a position of trust.
- We will seek to offer pastoral care and support, including supervision and referral to the proper authorities, to any member of our church community known to have offended against a child, young person or vulnerable adult.
- In all these principles we will follow legislation, guidance and recognised good practice

The Newquay Perranporth & St Agnes Circuit commits itself to ensuring the implementation of Connexional Safeguarding Policy; government legislation, guidance and safe practice in the circuit and in the churches.

The Newquay Perranporth & St Agnes Circuit commits itself to the provision of support, advice and training for lay and ordained people that will ensure people are clear and confident about their roles and responsibilities in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults who may be vulnerable.

Reserves Policy

The Reserves Policy for the Circuit is to hold a minimum sum equivalent to six months' average expenditure (approximately £75,000). This should be sufficient to meet any unforeseen item of major expenditure on manses and / or to be able to continue, in the short term, funding planned activities in the event of any inability to raise the full Circuit Assessment from churches.

The circuit had a deficit of £18,138 for the financial period ending 31 August 2020.

At the year end reserves totalling £1,420,736 were held by the Circuit, of which free reserves were £503,387 (Unrestricted This is greater than the amount required in the Reserves Policy of the Circuit. Therefore there are sufficient reserves held at year end.

Notes to the Accounts

1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable 102 and Financial Reporting Standard 102 section 1A.

2 Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the Circuit which are Unrestricted. The Circuit Model Trust Fund has wide purposes defined in Standing Orders and is categorised as unrestricted. Restricted funds which are held for a narrower purpose. Details of each material fund are disclosed in the final note to these accounts. Any funds may be represented by more than just cash.

3 Accounting policies

Basis

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

Income Recognition

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources, and the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Resources Expended

This is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment being unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely than not under the legal or constructive obligation committing the Circuit to pay out resources.

Grants

Grants made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the time of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than one year the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

VAT

Since the Circuit is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the Circuit

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and individually cost at least £1,000.

The freehold property is shown in the accounts at original cost. No depreciation is provided on the building because the trustees consider the current residual fair value of the manse buildings (on the assumption that it had reached the end of its useful economic life by the year-end) to be not less than its current value. Any depreciation would not be material. The property has been reviewed for impairment.

Investment Properties

This includes properties which are not used for the purposes of the charity. They are held at market value as provided by the Circuit Stewards.

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Debtors and Prepayments

Debtors relate to the payment of the September stipend in August together with other accrued income and prepayments.

Creditors

Creditors include both sundry expenses accruals and specifically the 1st quarter assessment received in August.
