Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Chairperson

During the Covid pandemic the Church premises have been closed. Initially, daily Zoom reflections were available for members. As time went on Sunday services were produced on Zoom and in the last few months on YouTube, with a chance for members to join in a Zoom meeting after the service to chat and share experiences. We have also celebrated the Church Festivals of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter online. Christmas cards and palm crosses with an Easter prayer were delivered to all members.

We have said 'farewell' to several dearly loved friends either moving away or passing away. Unfortunately the Wednesday Friendship Group for those coping with bereavement has also been suspended, but it is hoped that the Group will reform when the Government guidelines allow.

Our Thursday Coffee Morning, a valuable outreach event, has also been suspended, but it is hoped that this will also start up when possible.

The Church magazine has been produced weekly, instead of monthly and emailed to members. Friends with no internet have been given a printed copy.

Colourful illustrated messages of hope and encouragement have been attached to the Church glass doors during the pandemic, for passing members of the public and showing that St. Andrew's is very much alive, even if the Church building is closed.

Property Group

General maintenance and electrical inspections have continued during the pandemic, thanks to our faithful Leader of the Property Group.

Lettings of Church Premises

As the Church premises were closed from March 2020, all Church groups and lettings to outside groups ceased from that date. The loss of lettings has resulted a big drop in income for the Church.

Pastoral Secretary

During the pandemic the roles of the Pastoral Secretary and Pastoral Visitors have been even more important, keeping in touch with members. Some small groups of members have met, at intervals and when the weather allowed, in parks and open places. This was important to keep in touch with friends with no internet access, who were not able to see the Zoom/YouTube Service.

Safeguarding

The Safeguarding representative for St. Andrew's Church makes sure that we have the procedures in place to keep both our children **and** our vulnerable adults safe. However, all members have a part to play in safeguarding and should become informed and undergo training if involved with these two groups.

There have been no disclosures made concerning either children or vulnerable adults this year.

Thursday Toddlers

This group has been closed during the pandemic, but it is hoped to restart as soon as Government guidelines allow. In normal times this group attracts about 30 children, with their respective adults. The group gives the adults chance to get together whilst the children play and do various craft activities.

Messy Church

Messy Church has also been suspended during the pandemic. Usually Messy Church takes place on the second Sunday in each month. Activities, games and crafts are always based on a Bible story. After a 'Show and Tell' type of worship in the Church families go back into the hall for conversation and fun over a lovely meal.

It is hoped that Messy Church will start up again when Government guidelines allow.

Tuesday Fellowship

This group has also been suspended during the pandemic, but members have kept in touch by phone and meeting in small groups in parks and open places in the town.

It is hoped that this group will also restart when Government guidelines allow.

Choir and Music Group

The three Church organists have taken part in the online Services with members of the Choir.

The Music Group has been an invaluable part of our online worship, each member being recorded separately and then

cleverly linked together on screen. Church members have greatly appreciated the work involved in producing music for the online worship.

Ladies Evening Group

Members have kept in touch by phone, internet and meeting in small groups in open places during the pandemic. It is hoped that this group will re-form when possible.

Social & Catering (SOCAT)

As the Church premises have been closed during the pandemic, this Group has not been involved in any catering events.

House Groups

Members of the House Group have kept in touch with regular Zoom meetings, providing quality time in which all sorts of life and faith matters are talked about. Members support each other and pray for situations they are concerned about.

Poetry Group

The Poetry Group has been suspended during the pandemic, but it is hoped that it will continue when the Church re-opens.

St. Andrew's Traidcraft Stall

Limited amounts of Traidcraft goods have been ordered and purchased by members of St. Andrew's Church during the pandemic.

Art Group

This Group has also been suspended during the pandemic. It is hoped to open up again when the Church re-opens.

	The target level of reserves is between £30,000 to £40,000: £15,000 to £20,000 for working capital and £15,000 to £20,000 for unforeseed circumstances and opportunities. Actual general reserves at 31 August 2020 were £41,718 (2019: £48,816).
	Restricted Funds are utilised for the purposes for which the funds have been set aside. The funds are utilised in a time frame set by the Church Council. Actual restricted reserves at 31 August 2020 were £5,191 (2019 £13,278) to be used mainly for repairs, maintenance and improvements to property and equipment.
