Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>Between the Months of September 2019-February 2020, the charity has delivered sessions to year 10 and 12 students in Harris Academy Boys East Dulwich. Sessions covered common challenges experienced by members of the SPED community such as stigmatisation, employment difficulties and mental health.</p> <p>Students were encouraged to give presentations to fellow peers in their year group summarising what they had learnt, as well as writing short academic essays which reflected on the key themes taught to them.</p> <p>The sessions were delivered by both the Trustees of the organisation and paid staff. Paid staff accounted for £86 during this period.</p> <p>Due to the pandemic, All activity had to cease during March 2020 – July 2020.</p> <p>During August 2020- November 2020, The activities which aimed to address our objectives covered two themes: (i) Building a programme addressing the core themes expressed in our school sessions which can be delivered online to include 6th form students from a wider range of schools in London and (ii) Using Social media to</p>

		<p>advertise our previous work and inform potential donors of what is to come in terms of the charities objectives of raising awareness.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The building of an online programme which can be delivered to 6th formers online costs the charity [£60] which expense was staff costs. - The social media responsibilities delegated to staff costed the charity [£36].

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<p>Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.</p>	<p>Para 1.20</p>	<p>During the Course of September 2019-February 2020, the Charity has been delivering workshops to Year 10 and 12 students in Harris Academy Boys East Dulwich on Raising Awareness of neurodiversity, the sources of stigmatisation and the effects it could have on the neurodiverse community. The following positive impacts were generated.</p> <p>Impact on the Neurodiverse Community: A market research survey covered with the year 10s and 12s demonstrated an overall positive change in perceptions of dyslexia and Autism, with an overall 56% percent accuracy increase on the traits associated with these special educational differences.</p> <p>2 students of the Year 12 programme also delivered a session educating on the impact of Media on perceptions of Autism and one has written a short article covering a similar topic.</p> <p>Overall, 94% of the students on the programme reported that they felt confident in their development of their public speaking, writing and critical thinking skills to raise awareness to the general public.</p> <p>Ratings of our Sessions and its impact on self-development of the students who attend: 100% of the participants rated all the sessions of the programme excellent or outstanding.</p> <p>One of the most amazing feedback reflecting the difference our programme can make was echoed by one of our year 12 students on the programme who mentioned <i>"It was actually such a fun and informative programme. I learnt so much about the differences that people have to face on a regular basis which I never would have learnt about if I hadn't signed up!"</i></p> <p>Charity activity during Pandemic: During August 2020 – November 2020, the Charity has been focussing on developing online programmes which cover the same objectives. The next annual financial report will cover how the Charity's planning has come into effect.</p>

Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set	Para 1.41	<p>This financial year, the charity has been raising funds both via physical and online means.</p> <p>Physical donations have been through leaving buckets with our charity logo in a local shop for collecting spare change during September 2020 to January 2021. During the financial year, the charity has gathered £20.04 through this method.</p> <p>Through advertisement online via our charity Social media pages, we have been also gathering online donations on our GoFundMe page and PayPal donations page. Our GoFundMe Page has gathered a total of £70 between June 2020 to November 2020. Our PayPal donations has amassed £85.37 Between June 2020 to November 2020.</p> <p>The Charity has also been collecting contribution from family and friends which has contributed to £500 during this financial period.</p> <p>In terms of securing a stable donation from a company, A meeting was to be held with the Wech Foundation after a series of correspondence via e-mail regarding our charity activities in March 2020. However, due to the Pandemic this meeting had to be postponed until further notice. 




