Following the final tranches of grant money in March, there were sufficient reserves to enable the Charity to ride out the period of shut-down without going into deficit. Continuing generous donations to the Charity have helped, and the re-opening of the building means that income is now sufficient to cover the ongoing expenditure on utilities, caretaker's pay and the extra expense of Covid 19 precautions
